A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Fiedler to approve the agenda. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Fiedler and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Nichols to approve Blanket Voucher #202504 for Claim #'s 22032-22043 in the amount of \$22,094.96 and Payroll #'s 22029-22031 in the amount of \$2,150.00 for a Grand Total of \$24,244.96. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Milanowski to approve the purchase order to HD Fowler for Flow meters and parts for installation at the WTP in the amount of \$22,561.55 and turbidimeter repair kit from HACH in the amount of \$1048.00. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Nichols to approve the utility bill adjustment of Acct# 1480 in the amount of \$204.00 for a leak in the service line. Motion passed unanimously.

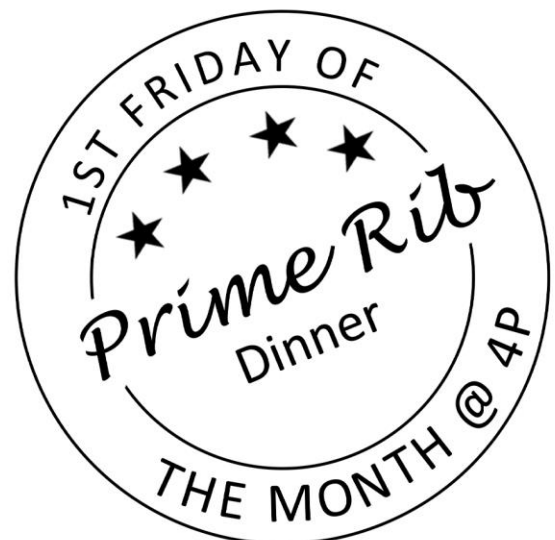

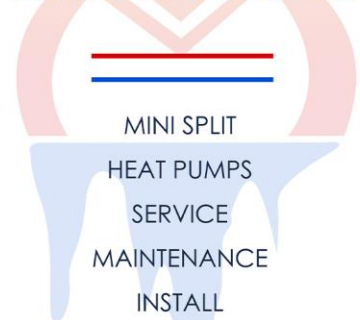

The full Blood Worm Moon reaches its peak in the morning hours of Friday, March 14. What is a Worm Moon? What is a Blood Moon?

This is more than just another full Moon! There is also going to be a Total Lunar Eclipse, also known as a Blood Moon. During a lunar eclipse, the Sun, Moon, and Earth all align so that the Earth comes in between the Moon and Sun. This means that the Earth will cast a shadow over the Moon (also known as the umbra). When the Moon is in the umbra of the Earth, the Earth casts a reddish shadow, hence the name Blood Moon.

The name Worm Moon refers to a different sort of "worm"—beetle larvae—which begin to emerge from the thawing bark of trees and other winter hideouts at this time.

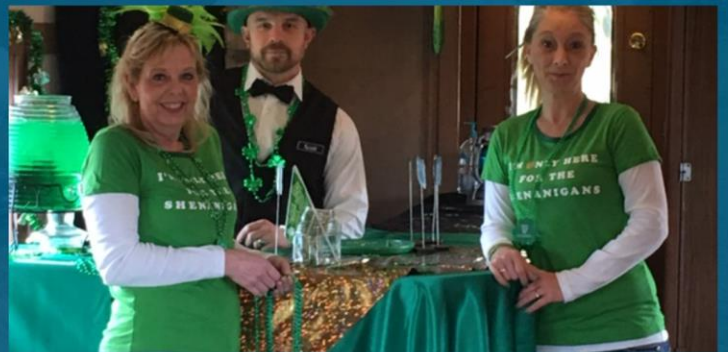

Celebrate Irish Style with our St. Patrick's Day Dinner Train
