Hello friends. Thank you all for being so understanding with me getting this newsletter out so late after our 2024 National in SD. It has been 2 months since. Jeremy, Gene, Kevin, Hailey, and Conrad are back from the World Ploughing Match in Estonia. # USAPO National Plowing Competition in Arlington, SD July 11<sup>th</sup> through 13<sup>th</sup>, 2024

The 2024 USAPO National meet was held July 11<sup>th</sup> through the 13<sup>th</sup> in Arlington, SD. That is west of Brookings a bit. The SD State match was held before the National with concurrent USAPO National practice times. The weather was sunny and some would say on the warm or hot side. The National was held on John Gaard's land in Arlington with oat stubble. The renter of the land surely wanted to harvest his oats but had to change plans to have the stubble ready for competition. A very wide swather came in and laid the oats down and a large Krause silage chopper chopped the green oats into semis. The operation worked on an angle so as not to leave tram lines parallel to the plowing. Nicely done. The soil conditions were good and got better I think as one moved to the north. I did notice on the southerly end that if you plowed too deep one brought up some sticky clay which stuck to my non-plastic boards. Most standard classes were offered for the USAPO National, namely, Antique, Senior and Junior Open, Small Plow, Vintage Small Plow, and Reversible for senior and junior participation. This was the third year for the Vintage Small Plow Class that was well attended. Again, Ohio had a good contingent of plowpersons along with all the SD plowpersons.

The 2024 USAPO National Match was organized by the South Dakota State Plowing Association with special thanks to John Gaard, Courtney Gaard and her folks, Aaron Egeberg, Tim Brown, and Ryan Olson and the rest of the SD club. The onsite food was prepared by Courtney and her folks and was well received and appreciated. The banquet was held in Lake Preston at the Legion Hall. The food and venue were excellent.

The 2024 National Match was very well organized with good plowing conditions even though having to overcome oats-on-the-field just prior.

John Gaard handed out proposed USAPO rule changes for the directors to review.

Previous Minutes - Previous Director's Meeting minutes from March 18<sup>th</sup>, 2024 were reviewed. Bob Miller moved to approve the minutes and the financial report, Mike Rhoades seconded. Passed

Financial Report - The financial report from the last general membership meeting till the present was read. (Please see the financial report for the General Membership Meeting following these minutes.) Mike Rhoades moved to accept the treasurers report. Mike Fitz seconded. Passed

JHW recommended to roll the USAPO's CD into another CD when the current CD time is elapsed. Mike Rhoades moved to negotiate the CD interest rate when rolling over the current CD to a new term. Mike Fitz seconded, Passed

### Director's Reports -

IA – Mike Fitz. IA is still looking for a new site for the IA championship due to recent flooding.

IL - Don Klehm. No report.

MN – Gene Gruber. MN State match will be on August 23-24. Jeremy Nietfeld and Gene Gruber leaving Aug 1<sup>st</sup> for Estonia with Hailey Gruber, Kevin Albrecht, and Conrad Gruber.

OH – Mike Rhoades. The 2025 National will be in OH August 8-9 on the Dircksen Farm. The OH State and National will be about 7 miles from Greenville, OH. OH State Championship will be in a few weeks. Expect 37 contestants with 5 new plowpersons.

SD – John Gaard. Welcome to the USAPO Nationals. There has been lots of rain so plowing conditions should be good.

PA – Bob Miller. PA States were in May this year. Down a little bit in attendance but a good group of plowmen.

CT – Joel Wagner. No report.

WPO Report – Gene Gruber. Nothing to report. The WPO is considering a 23 and under class for the Worlds. More to come.

#### **New Business:**

- New apparel report for the 2024 World Ploughing Meet. The USAPO representatives to the world meet in Estonia will have new jackets and t-shirts for 2024.
- Reviewed a 2010 USAPO financial report that included giving the USAPO world plowmen
   \$5000 for some expenses that also covered some land rental for prepractice. This practice of

supporting the USAPO world plowpersons has apparently been discontinued. However, about this time two containers with a conventional and reversable plow in each were fabricated so that USA plowmen could use good plowing equipment with borrowed or rented tractors at the world meets. In recent years our USA plowmen have been shipping personal tractors to the world meets and we have been paying minimal storage fees for the two containers still located in Germany.

- Gene Gruber recommends prepaying the container rental cost to keep in good standing. Gene
  provided a history of the containers. Additionally, Gene suggests that shipping personal plows
  to the world meets costs about the same as shipping the USAPO containers to the world
  meets with USAPO funding. This cost of shipping the containers maybe should be donated to
  the USAPO plowmen to help offset the cost of shipping personal equipment.
- John Gaard reviewed the updated rule changes adding juniors and vintage classes and how
  to break ties. The tie-breaking process would be similar to that of the World Ploughing
  Organization and the Ontario International Plowing Match rules. Gene Gruber moves to
  accept the rules changes. Mike Rhoades seconded subject to review at the next board
  meeting. Passed.
- Need to approve the IA, IL, and OH directors for 2-year appointments. Joel Wagner moves to approve. Mike Fitz seconded. Passed.
- Election of USAPO officers was discussed. Mike Fitz moved to accept the existing officers.
   Bob Miller seconded. Joel Wagner suggests each director go back to their state memberships to see if anyone wants to be the USAPO Sec/Treas or help out the existing Sec/Treas. It was noted that the USAPO officers were elected from the Board of Directors. Passed.

# World Ploughing Organization Ploughing Competition in Tartu, Estonia August 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>, 2024

The 69th World Ploughing Championship 2024 was held in Tartu, Estonia on August 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>, 2024. Gene Gruber and Jeremy Nietfeld were our USA Plowpersons with Hailey Gruber as Coach and Kevin Albrecht as the USA Judge. Our USAPO World Ploughing Organization representative was Conrad Gruber. I would venture that a mid-August date for the World Ploughing event is a bit earlier than customary. Of course, our team went to Estonia for a prepractice week of plowing the first week of August before the competition week of August 11-17.

There was a small group of Estonians running the world meet. They worked very hard to have a well organized event. The competitors had college dorms for accomodations similar to those in York England a while back. There was a tour day on Sunday before official practice. The tour went to a dairy farm with a farm museum and a nature park with working horse stables.

There was some rain during the prepractice week but the weather was good for final day of prectice and for the competition days. It is reported that there were some tram lines in the plots but our professional plowmen were able to handle that. Our plowmen represented the USA Plowing Organization well. Both of our plowmen were in the conventional class. Gene Gruber was 4<sup>th</sup> in stubble with a score of 177 and 6<sup>th</sup> in grass with a score of 170 placing 6<sup>th</sup> overall. Jeremy Nietfeld did very well as well with a 14<sup>th</sup> in stubble with a score of 149 and 10<sup>th</sup> in grass with a score of 152, placing 12<sup>th</sup> overall. You all need to know that when I was practicing and setting up this unknown plow, Don Klehm, my first USAPO friend, stopped by and gave my brother and me a lot of pointers. I knew then that this was a sport for me as so many were so friendly. I've made many friends since then. How else would I have met Werner Gruber, Bernie Nietfeld, the Gaards, Mike Fitz, Kevin Holl, Mike Rhoades and so many more too numerous to mention. We have a great sport and organization and we need to do everything possible to keep it going.
