The Entry Fee in all **Adult/Open classes** (e.g., Feature Classes) is **\$1.00** per exhibit. ****Each Entry must have a Ticket****

The Entry in all **Student Classes** is free. Entries in student classes are only eligible for student specific prizes. If students wish to enter open classes, e.g., Feature Classes and Challenges, the **\$1.00 entry fee will apply**.

Class Place Prizes: Unless otherwise specified, prize money will be paid as follows:

1st place will receive \$5.00

2nd place will receive \$2.00

3rd place will receive \$1.00

All cash prize money will be paid out at the Show Office during the specified times.

All Sponsor Vouchers/ Prizes are to be collected with the exhibits in the Pavilion during the specified times. There is no longer an Award Presentation.

Most Successful Exhibitors

Most Successful Exhibitors are determined by adding points that an Exhibitor earns from winning Class Placings where 3 points are allotted for 1st place, 2 points for 2nd place and 1 point for 3rd place. Points are not earned for Feature, Student Classes or Challenges.

Feature Classes

They are ordinary classes which offer significant cash prizes. Some Sections have a feature, and the exhibits will be returned to the entrant except for the cakes.

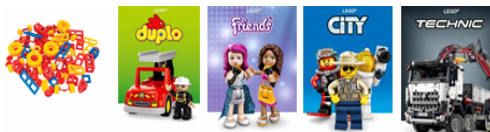

Horticulture Hints and Tips from the Judges

- Take blighted petals off, leave a few leaves on
- Remove diseased or leaves with holes.
- Take extra buds off on 'Rosebud' or other single bloom category.
- Rosebud must be open a little to show opening petals coming from centre.
- Blow gently on bud to open it a little more if necessary.
- Cut Coleus 3 days before needed, immerse stems in water to prevent drooping on judging day.
- Insert small wad of newspaper behind single stem to make firm & prevent container falling over.

- Trough – rectangular container.
- Single flower category – flower must be dominant not the foliage.
- **First named** must be predominant – e.g., **Fruit & Flowers, Flowers & Driftwood**.
- Try to avoid rigid lines especially in dried arrangements, soften with wood shavings, pods etc.
- Hessian or other material maybe draped over container, so eye goes first to arrangement.
- Flower/s may be purchased for arrangements.
- Cut flowers, pot plants must be grown & cultivated by exhibitor.
- All arrangements to be in water.
- Single Gerbera – 1 row petals only

Is awarded to the Most Successful Entrant who gains the most combined points in Cakes, Scones, Biscuits and Slices.

Class G1: Orange and Almond Cake

Ingredients:

- 2 Oranges, Washed
- 250g Castor Sugar, plus extra for dusting
- 6 Eggs
- 250g Almond Meal
- 1Tsp Baking Powder
- Icing Sugar, to serve



Instructions:

- 1 Bring a large pot of water to the boil. Wash the oranges and cook in the boiling water for 2 hours. Drain, allow to cool to room temperature, then puree. This step can be done ahead of time.
- 2 Preheat the oven to 160°C. Grease and line a 22cm spring form cake tin with baking paper.
- 3 Beat the eggs and castor sugar until well combined.
- 4 Stir in the orange puree followed by the almond meal and baking powder.
- 5 Pour the batter into the prepared tin and dust the top with extra caster sugar. Bake for 1 to 1&1/4 hours, until the top is golden and a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean.
- 6 Allow to cool in the tin. Dust with icing sugar.
- 7 **COOKS NOTES** Oven temperatures are for conventional ovens, if using fan-forced (convection), reduce the temperature by 20°C.

G2 Sub-Chamber Dark Rich Fruit Cake

For Queensland Ag Shows Sub-Chamber Dark Rich Fruit Cake competition, the rules generally require a 500g cake mixture made with approximately 2.25kg of dried fruit, Using Currents, Sultanas and Raisins with optional Cherries and Nuts. Prunes and Figs are not permitted. The cake should be baked in a 25.5cm (10inch) square tin.

Only one entry per Sub-Chamber is allowed, and the winner can represent that Sub-Chamber at the State Final, which is held at the Ekka.

Key Rules and Guidelines:

- **Cake Size and Weight:** The cake should be a 500g (approximately 1lb) mixture.
- **Fruit:** The cake should contain a substantial amount of dried fruit.
- **Tin Size:** The cake must be baked in a **Square Tin** with approximate internal measurements of 25.5cm (10 inches)
- **Sub-Chamber Representation:** The winner of the Sub-Chamber competition represents their area in the State Final which is held at the Ekka.
- **State Final Submission:** For the State Final a new cake is required using the competitor's own recipe.
- **Recipe:** Competitors are encouraged to use their own tried and tested recipe.
- **Sub-Chamber Runner Up:** If the Sub-Chamber winner is unable to compete in the State Final, the runner up may be eligible

G2 Sub-Chamber: Dark Rich Fruit Cake

Bake in a Square Tin, One Pound or 500g mixture including Currants, Sultanas, Raisins, with optional Cherries and Nuts. **NO** Prunes or Figs. The winner (or the runner up if winner unavailable) is eligible to enter the 2026 South Burnett Sub-Chamber Rich Fruit Cake Competition. Contact Show Secretary for more information.

Culinary Hints and Tips from the Judges

- Tap down lightly before placing tin in oven.
- Do not use skewer to test if cake is cooked. *It will leave a mark in the centre.*
- Line cake cooler (tea towel) so no marks on base
- Mix should be moist and rise evenly without cracks.
- If unsure if cake is cooked place an ear near tin – a noise will mean return to oven to complete cooking.
- A cake leaving the side of tin is usually cooked.
- When icing, keep to thin layer and leave the centre free of decoration.
- Cut raisins for rich fruit cake – cake improves in flavour if made early.
- Pikelets should be round and thin so as they can be rolled without cracking.
- Use a 5cm cutter for scones. Place almost touching on tray. Brush top with liquid. Cook in hot oven to brown. Dust flour from base of scone. Use the first cut only.
- Slices should be cut into even 5cm squares.
- Biscuits must be crisp, brown and have the flavour of the variety.
