Horticulture Hints and Tips from the Judges

- Take blighted petals off, leave a few leaves on
- Remove diseased or leaves with holes.
- Take extra off on 'Rosebud' or other single bloom category.
- Rosebud must be open a little to show opening petals coming from centre.
- Blow gently on bud to open it a little more if necessary.
- Cut Coleus 3 days before needed, immerse stems in water to prevent drooping on judging day.
- Insert small wad of newspaper behind single stem to make firm & prevent container falling over.
- Trough rectangular container
- Single flower category flower must be dominant not the foliage.
- First named must be predominant e.g., Fruit & Flowers, Flowers & Driftwood
- Try to avoid rigid lines especially in dried arrangements, soften with wood shavings, pods etc.
- Hessian or other material maybe draped over container, so eye goes first to arrangement.
- Flower/s may be purchased for arrangements.
- Cut flowers, pot plants must be grown & cultivated by exhibitor.
- All arrangements to be in water.
- Single Gerbera 1 row petals only

CULINARY FEATURE CLASS

*(Entry Fee: \$1:00) *

Class G1 Chocolate Layer Cake - (8 Inch or 20cm Ring Tin)

Ingredients:

1 3/4 Cups Plain Flour2 Eggs Room Temperature2/3 Cup (65gm) unsweetened½ Cup Neutral Oil (Canola)Cocoa Powder2 Tsp. Vanila Extract

1 ½ tsp. Baking Powder 1 Cup (240mls) Butter or Whole Milk

1 ½ tsp. Baking Soda 1 Cup (240mls) Hot Water

3/4 Cup Brown Sugar Optional: To enhance flavour: Replace some hot Water with Strong coffee or add 2 oz of melted dark chocolate into hot water.

Instruction:

- 1: Preheat oven to 180c Generously butter 2, 8 inch cake pans that are at least 2 inches high. Dust with cocoa powder, tapping the pans lightly to remove any excess.
- 2: In a Lge. Bowl, place flour, cocoa powder, baking powder, baking soda, salt, and sugar. Mix until combined. Set aside.
- 3. In the medium bowl, mix together eggs, oil, vanilla, buttermilk / or whole milk. Whisk until smooth. Add egg mixture into flour mix until smooth.

DON'T OVER BEAT – Batter will be lumpy at first but mix gently and eventually stir with a whisk until smooth. The batter will be VERY thin & Liquid. Bake for 30 mins or it springs back to touch.

Join with Butter Icing.

Culinary Hints and Tips from the Judges

- Tap down lightly before placing tin in oven.
- Do not use skewer to test if cake is cooked. *It will leave a mark in the centre.*
- Line cake cooler (tea towel) so no marks on base
- Mix should be moist and rise evenly without cracks.
- If unsure if cake is cooked place an ear near tin a noise will mean return to oven to complete cooking.
- A cake leaving the side of tin is usually cooked.
- When icing, keep to thin layer and leave the centre free of decoration.
- Cut raisins for rich fruit cake cake improves in flavour if made early.
- Pikelets should be round and thin so as they can be rolled without cracking.

- Use a 5cm cutter for scones. Place almost touching on tray. Brush top with liquid. Cook in hot oven to brown. Dust flour from base of scone. Use the first cut only.
- Slices should be cut into even 5cm squares.
- Biscuits must be crisp, brown and have the flavour of the variety.



Hints & tips for exhibiting your photos

- Presentation is important cut mounts neatly and straight and then attach
 photo to mount squarely.
- Black mounts present most photographs well. White and colours are acceptable.
- Mounts may have lines and borders, ensure that these are straight.
- No other marks on the front of mounts
- Make sure the photograph is in the relevant Class

Hints & tips for good photographs

- Check that horizons are level.
- Use close objects like trees or leaves to frame your scene.
- Look for interesting details in subjects and consider moving closer.
- Take your time, take more than one shot.
- Consider the lighting in portraits.
- Use of a flash can reduce shadows particularly for portraits in strong sunlight.
- Automatic flash works within a set range. Too close will overexpose (drain colour) from subjects. Too far away will underexpose and lack contrast.
- Look at picture books, photography magazines and photography websites for ideas.
- Expensive camera equipment is not necessary just good ideas.
- The best camera you have is the one you have with you. Use your phone, tablet, point and shoot, compact or DSLR. There is a digital device to suit everybody, encourage your children to capture images with these too.
