But the legacy of Lent is not that God lets us flounder, alone and forgotten amid a sea of troubles. Lent is not an end, but a preparation for the great Paschal feast, where we witness anew the life of Christ conquering death and the grave. It's into the valley of the shadow of death that Christ comes to us. As we look forward to Holy Week, and the fulfillment of our Lenten journey, I want to invite people once more to be a part of some collaborative storytelling, using simple tabletop role-playing similar to what we tried during Advent. 



- Social Ministry funds allow the congregation and committee to respond to new opportunities during a budget year.
- **Budget and Financial Management** Assistance, founded by a former Immanuel member, fosters financial stability by providing budgeting, bill payment and advocacy as a representative payee to disabled, homeless and elderly persons in the Kansas City metro.

Local Outreach

- **Cross-Lines** serves low-income and disadvantaged residents, mostly in Kansas City, Kan. Programs include caseworker assistance for people in crisis, home repair, summer youth activities, a food pantry and utility/rent assistance.
- Emergency Needs funds are used at the discretion of our pastor to confidentially, appropriately and quickly respond to needs.
- Hollis Renewal Center, a Lutheran outdoor renewal center, hosts many activities and retreats for individuals and groups, including Immanuel, that seek spiritual renewal amid nature's beauty.
- **Inner-City Missions** funding supports agencies that minister directly to inner-city people in ways that Immanuel does not and helps us build partnerships for our own continuing contact with inner-city needs.
