

FROM PASTOR MICAH



Highlights of the September 17, 2019 Council Meeting

- Pastor announced that on November 2nd at 2:00 pm there will be a wine tasting event to choose wines for 2020. Participants need to RSVP for planning purposes.
- The Council welcomed the addition of TerRa Teague as our new Administrative Assistant.
- President Mary Jo Moore indicated there has not been a recent evaluation of the management of ILC's investment portfolio. Action on an assessment process was tabled to give the Endowment Trust Fund Committee time to respond.
- Jack Umbach suggested the Property Committee prepare a more formal notification plan for handling outages. The action item will be addressed by the Property Committee.
- The Council accepted the resignation of Dean Byrom from the Council, as Dean and Beth have left ILC and ELCA.


FROM THE PREZ

At last night's meeting of the Steering Committee, Pastor asked each of us to think about an answer to a question, and to come prepared to share it at the next meeting. For those of you wondering, what is the Steering Committee, it is a 10-member group that is representative of our congregation and that is tasked with discerning the mission of Immanuel and ministries supportive of this mission.

And the question? I'm paraphrasing, but basically something along the lines of "If money presented no obstacles to Immanuel, what would be different? Or said another way, what are our dreams and visions for Immanuel? We were encouraged to think big and out-of-the-box, unburdened by the usual constraints placed upon us.

Believers are to bear witness to the saving grace of Jesus Christ. We modern-day disciples, like those in biblical times, are to place our faith in God above all else and not worry. Matthew 6:31-34 says So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.

If, as some have suggested, the Kingdom is the fulfillment on Earth of God's will and righteousness is conduct becoming of Christ, what does this mean for Immanuel? I will be reflecting on these things over the next couple of weeks and trust in God to reveal an answer to Pastor's question. I will not worry about tomorrow.
