

From Pastor Micah





Now is the season of resolutions and commitments, some of which may even make it into February, if we *really* keep at it. Maybe it's cliché, to remark on fleeting nature of many New Year's Resolutions, but it conveys a common truth about human experience: that change is hard. There's an irony in that, given that change is inevitable. The world around us is always in flux, and the

same is true of ourselves, whether we're aware of it or not. It's why I'm such an ardent believer in the Lutheran tradition. Our heritage isn't as an individual church body, but as an ecumenical movement, crying out for reform and change throughout the wider church. It doesn't always come easy, and it's often met with resistance, but together as the body of Christ, we can change the world.

I had the privilege this past Advent of leading a mid-week series based on apocalyptic storytelling. We imagined ourselves living through the end of the world, and it lead to some interesting, often surprising places. There was on moment in particular that stuck out to me, as the group was weighing their options and preparing to make some difficult choices, one person reminded everyone gathered there of a truth we can easily forget: "our strength is the community to have, and our ability to help each other."

As the new year dawns, and we continue to face an increasingly divided world, I hope that we can remember that simple truth, and lead on one another. We may find that we're capable of greater things than we thought.

Friends of Literature meets Thursday January 10th at 7:30. We are at the home of Jan and Steve Roeder. The book is a new, very unique novel by George Saunders. The novel takes place during and after the death of Abraham Lincoln's son "Willie" Lincoln and deals with the president's grief at his loss. The bulk of the novel, which takes place over the course of a single evening, is set in the bardo—an intermediate space between life and rebirth. Lincoln in the Bardo received critical acclaim, and won the 2017 Man Booker Prize. Time magazine listed it as one of its top ten novels of 2017.

At its December 18th meeting, the Congregation Council took the following actions:

- Pastor Sievenpiper advised the Christmas Eve Services will be at 5pm and 9pm. Per his report the Advent series is going very well and leading to interesting discussions.
- Pastor will be assembling a team to help guide the long term vision for Immanuel.
- Over all the MLM Christmas Store experience for 2018 was a success with nearly 1000 families receiving gifts.
- Council is looking at ways to identify and pursue options that would result in lowering our debt. A motion was approved to investigate options to pay down the loan and adjust the term to better fit our budget. Kate Hauber will lead a team to investigate the options.
- The ILC Audit Committee Report for 2017 has been reviewed. There were two committee recommendations. 1) One concerning the reconciliation and funding of dedicated fund accounts by year end. Due to cash flow issues and receiving December's financials from our accounting firm it is not possible to complete these tasks by year end. The Audit Committee recommends performing these tasks by end of the first quarter of the following year. It should be noted that it is basically a timing issue and that more than sufficient funds exist in other accounts to fund the accounts in question. 2) The Council should provide adequate space for the Treasurer to store 7 years of financial records. Both findings were accepted, approved in a motion, and will be implemented.
- The Stewardship Committee reports we have received 2019 financial pledges from 52 family units totaling \$247, 160. This represents a 6.5% increase over 2018 for those same families. Another letter will be forthcoming encouraging those who have yet to respond to do so.
- The Annual Meeting is scheduled for February 17, 2019.

Complete minutes will be available upon request from the church office once approved by Council at their January meeting.
