## **COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS**

### Highlights of the January 19, 2021, Council Meeting

- The vast majority of the meeting centered on 2021 Budget preparation. While not totally finalized the current budget includes anticipated revenues of \$343,000 and expenses totaling \$479,000, for a deficit of \$136,000. This represents a year over year budget increase in deficit spending of \$94,000. The increase is almost equally split between decreased revenues and increased expenses.
- The Council is exploring potential ways to decrease deficit spending. Among things reluctantly being considered are staffing implications and the potential sale of property. The Stewardship Committee will be contacting members whose commitment cards have not been received in order to verify our offering assumptions.
- Other items being explored are use of matching gift programs offered by organizations such as Amazon Smile, where 0.5% of eligible purchases can result in donations to charities of your choice.
- The finalized budget will be presented to the Congregation in two Zoom meetings: Sunday February 7th at 10:00 am following worship, and Wednesday February 10th at 7:00 pm.
- The Annual Meeting will also be conducted via Zoom on February 21st at 10:00 am. The two critical agenda items will be approval of the 2021 Budget and the election of open positions on the Council and several Committees. Attempting a Zoom meeting will offer some unique challenges but with Congregational support we will all get through it.
- Terry Kueker reported that the Property Committee managed major repairs to the fire sprinkler and hot water systems in the new building. The repairs were necessitated due to a significant leak in the Gathering Space utility closet which shorted out the mentioned systems. The total cost of the repairs will be in excess of \$4,000.

Thankfully, all water systems now are back in working order — a must for the children and staff of Purple Dragon Day Care and for all people who are or will be in our building. But Immanuel now has bills for new equipment and labor that will total in excess of several thousand dollars once the invoices are totaled. It's an unanticipated cost for an emergency that required immediate action, and it exceeds Immanuel's budget for repairs and maintenance.

If your personal budget allows, please consider making a special contribution to help cover these unexpected costs. If you can contribute, kindly designate your donation for "water repairs." Immanuel will receive donations of any amount with gratitude and thanksgiving. As you consider how you can participate, please also offer your prayers — for the volunteers and professionals who responded to the emergency, for the continued safety of all people who enter our church home, and for people throughout our community who experience emergencies but have no-one to turn to for help.

Thank you for your prayers, your generosity, and for helping to ensure that our building will be ready to welcome us when we can gather together physically once again.
