Sometimes, we aren't afforded the opportunity to rest, but when you're feeling weary and overwhelmed, remember that God created naps, and called them good.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Highlights of the February 16, 2021, Council Meeting

- Due to the COVID-19 pandemic the Audit Committee was unable to access the needed materials to perform the 2019 audit. Council authorized the Audit Committee to audit both 2019 and 2020 in 2021. A brief summary of both years will appear in the 2021 Annual Report.
- The Council approved a final version of the proposed 2021 Budget for inclusion in the Annual Report, and to be voted on at the Annual Congregational Meeting.
- President Mary Jo Moore walked the Council through the 2021 Annual Congregational Meeting agenda. Presentation assignments were also agreed upon.
- The final bill associated with the January 13th water leak was received bringing the total to \$5,078. Rick Sundell reported that approximately a dozen responses to the appeal, totaling roughly \$3,000 had been received to date.
- Pastor Micah gave an overview of the new ConfirmationPacket. Like so many things the COVID-19 pandemic has forced the need to overhaul the previous methodology in favor of a more self-directed approach. The new process is modeled after the Girl Scout and Eagle Scout programs. Confirmands will choose from an approved list of subjects/projects that they find important to their faith and then meet the requirements of those projects.

HOLY COMMUNION AT IMMANUEL

We are offering service of Holy Communion at Immanuel's back parking lot. Group sizes will need to be limited, to allow for distance between us, so please sign up for a spot ahead of time by clicking this link: <u>https://reopen.church/r/sRh0T9Ql</u>.

We're doing our best to mitigate the risk of gathering, and when we come together in these days of pandemic, there is a risk of spreading COVID-19. To help us limit that risk, we ask that you keep the following in mind.

- Please do not attend if you:
 - have tested positive for COVID-19, and have had any symptoms within the last 14 days
 - have had COVID-like symptoms (e.g., fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, etc.) within the last 72 hours
 - have had close contact with someone who has tested positive within the last 14 days
- Masks must be worn over your nose and mouth
- Please practice physical distancing, keeping 10 feet of separation from other people (aside from family members)
- Please practice safe hygiene while among other people (e.g., coughing and sneezing into your elbow)
- Bathrooms will not be available for use, as the church building will not be open
- Please do not attend if you have not registered.

Water leak devastates Immanuel's water systems. Can you help?_____

Watch your mail for a letter about how you can respond to unexpected expenses that were the result when a major water leak caused devastating electrical shorts in our building's sprinkler system, hot water recirculator, and the pump that expels water-heater exhaust outside the building.

Thankfully, all water systems now are back in working order — a must for the children and staff of Purple Dragon Day Care and for all people who are or will be in our building. But Immanuel now has bills for new equipment and labor that will total nearly \$5,000. It's an unanticipated cost for an emergency that required immediate action, and it exceeds Immanuel's budget for repairs and maintenance.

If your personal budget allows, please consider making a special contribution to help cover these unexpected costs. If you can contribute, kindly designate your donation for "water repairs." Immanuel will receive donations of any amount with gratitude and thanksgiving. As you consider how you can participate, please also offer your prayers — for the volunteers and professionals who responded to the emergency, for the continued safety of all people who enter our church home, and for people throughout our community who experience emergencies but have no-one to turn to for help.

Thank you for your prayers, your generosity, and for helping to ensure that our building will be ready to welcome us when we can gather together physically once again.
