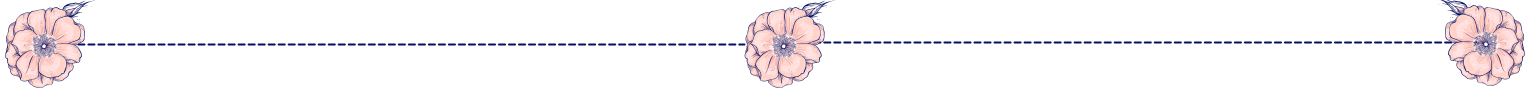

Highlights of the March 16, 2021, Council Meeting








MLM Christmas Store needs your new or gently used but no-longer-needed coats

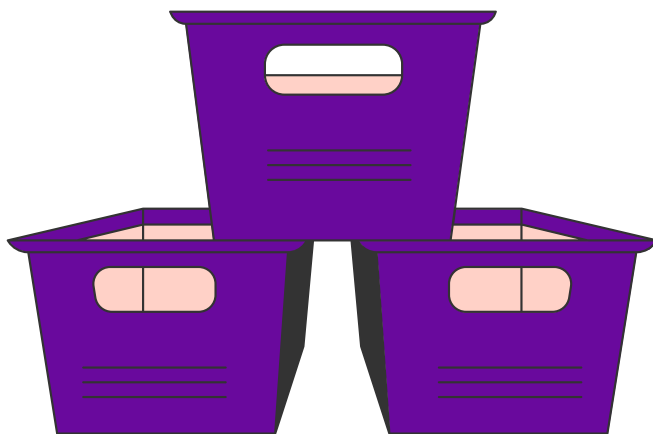
Warm coats are among the most sought after items at the Metro Lutheran Ministry (MLM) Christmas Store. But there never have been enough coats to go around.

You can help change that by donating new or gently used but no-longer-needed coats. Bring them to Immanuel:

- On any Sunday during April if you choose to attend in-person worship. Look for purple donation bins in the upstairs hallway.
- 9 a.m.-noon on either of two Saturdays, April 17 or 24. Members of the social ministry committee will be on the patio outside Immanuel's Bell St. entrance to accept your donations. They will wear masks and observe physical distancing.

"The MLM Christmas Store usually accepts new items only, but it accepts gently used coats because there is so much need," explains Beth Callstrom, who is Immanuel's liaison to MLM. "The store will serve 1,000 families this year and will need about 4,000 coats, so please look in the back of your coat closet, and pull out those coats that the kids have outgrown or those you no longer wear. Or watch the clearance rack at your favorite store for new coats. Your donations will make the holidays brighter and the winter warmer for families that shop at the Christmas Store."

Prayer Team Offers Monthly Vespers Services Online

What happens when the ancient practice of evening prayer meets up with modern communication technology?

Monthly vespers services on Zoom, presented by Immanuel's prayer team at 6:30 p.m. on the third Tuesday of each month.

With fear and anxiety around the pandemic, protests, fires, weather, incivility and the upcoming election mounting in October, the prayer team believed that a community gathering for evening prayer would be helpful. Comforting even. The precedent was already in place: the team had started offering monthly vespers services back in 2019. These in-person services preceded Immanuel's church council meetings and were held in the sanctuary using the ELW Evening Prayer service.

When the services moved online last fall, they took on a slightly different format. The team created a service using a simple liturgy, a psalm, and prayers drawn from the headlines. In addition, the services include a petition for healing that names both the Immanuel members on our prayer list as well as the individual friends and family members for whom prayers have been requested.

Moving vespers to Zoom made it easy for anyone to attend, and the service was kept to 20 minutes or less. Essentially, the services offer a monthly pause for prayer in the company of other Immanuel members.

The services will remain online even after in-person activities resume at Immanuel, in large part because they allow busy or homebound members to join the prayers without having to get in the car and drive to church.

The next service is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, April 20, on the congregation's main Zoom link.

Thanks in part to you, first-ever girls' washroom opens at Mamiloki Primary School in Kenya

The first-ever girls' washroom/bathroom at Mamiloki Primary School in Kenya was dedicated and officially opened March 10. It was funded in large part by Immanuel members' generous donations to the Kenyan Children's Fund.

"For many years, the school had a washroom for boys, but not for girls. That put girls at a disadvantage and, in some cases, kept them from going to school or staying in school for the entire day," says Jimmi Kimuyu, an Immanuel member and one of the founders of the Kenyan Children's Fund (KCF). "With the new washroom, which will serve female students for generations to come, that inequity now is a thing of the past."

Jimmi, who currently is in Mamiloki, supervised construction of the girls' washroom and was there to celebrate its opening with the students and community.

Since 2012, Immanuel donors have been leading contributors to the Kenyan Children's Fund. It provides poverty-stricken children and their guardians in the Mamiloki/Masii area of Kenya with monthly food supplements, crop seeds to enable people to grow their own food, assistance with school tuition and uniforms, goats to provide milk and much-needed income for needy families, a home-repair and construction program through which local people fix crumbling abodes or build their first and only shelters, pallets to keep people from sleeping on dirt floors, vaccinations and other health-care services that are crucial in an area ravaged by HIV/AIDS, and a Kenyan social worker who ensures that contributions meet urgent needs and who reports regularly to the KCF committee at Immanuel.

During 2017, donations to the KCF Water for Life program paid for construction of the region's first well, which now provides drinkable water to the parched region.

"Like the Water for Life program, constructing the girls' washroom was a special project that was possible only because of your generosity," Jimmi says. "The community and the students of Mamiloki Primary School send their gratitude and pray that Almighty God will richly bless you."

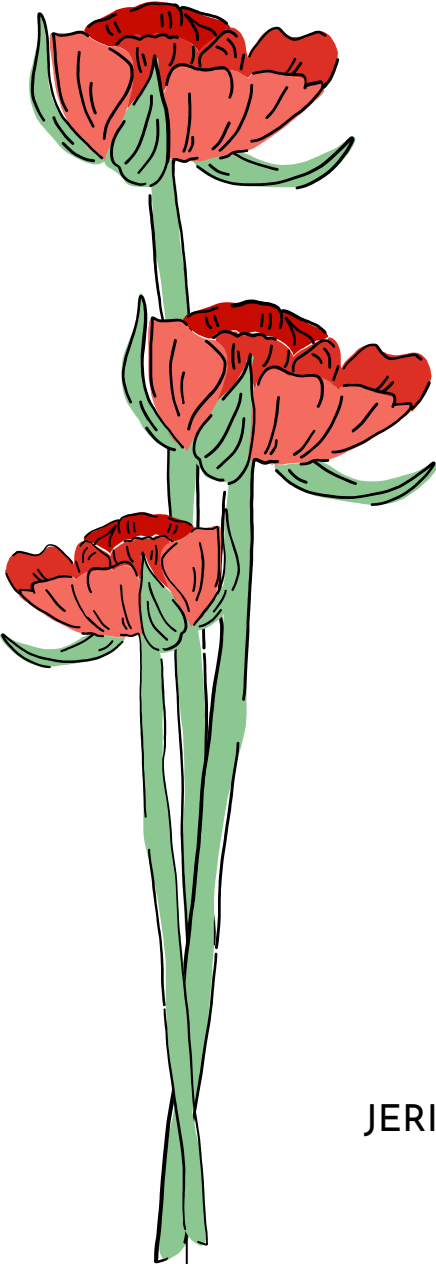


A March 10 dedication and ribbon-cutting marked the official opening of the girls' washroom at Mamiloki Primary School.

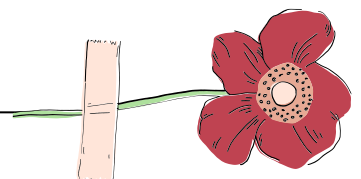


