People of God,

I often find that super villains are more compelling than the heroes they battle. I know that Lex Luthor, Superman's nemesis, is the bad guy, motivated mostly by greed. I understand that Magneto, who often sees things differently than the heroic X-Men, doesn't have human rights particularly high up on his list of priorities.

It's not that I think they're good role models, but their grievances are sometimes understandable. Some are motivated by a thirst for power but, in the stories I like best,

villains are more complicated than that. Lex Luthor often wants to bring Superman down to Earth so he has to experience the same consequences for his actions as everyone else. Magneto wants mutants, who are different than most of us, to be treated with respect instead of fear and revulsion. The villains' methods might be suspect, but their motivations are often understandable — even good.

Meanwhile, a lot of heroes seem to work for maintaining the status quo. Villains are a disruption to society, and heroes bring order. There are, of course, exceptions to this, but it's a trend I've encountered frequently, and it often rings hollow to me.

Sometimes, the status quo is not worth preserving. Sometimes, dramatic change is necessary to bring about a greater good. I'm not about to start a dramatic monologue like the the one the soon-to-be-defeated Joker of "Batman" fame delivers, but there's a reason so many of those monologues ring true: There is a lot about our world that is deeply broken.

I think that's the same reason I adore the season of Advent. It's a season for reckoning with the brokenness of the world, and for naming the hope of the gospel that promises to bring change. We hear the voice of John the Baptist crying in the wilderness, "Prepare the way of the Lord!" We hear the song of Mary, proclaiming the power of God who casts the mighty down from their thrones and lifts up the lowly.

Advent is a season for hope. It's a time to look at the world with honesty and name what needs to be redeemed. We look to the God who dwells among us, promising to bring justice and peace to every place.

This Advent, I hope we keep our eyes, our hearts and our minds open to see how God is calling us to be a part of this holy work.

once again will be part of our worship! Singing still will be somewhat limited, but we'll have several opportunities to joyfully lift our voices in praise.



# NEWS FROM YOUR CONGREGATION COUNCIL



Linda Fewell has accepted an offer to remain as Immanuel's administrative assistant on a permanent basis. To avoid potential conflicts of interest, she has tendered her resignation from the congregational council, from which she has been on hiatus since joining the church staff

on an interim basis. We welcome Linda as a permanent member of our staff, but will miss her input on council.

**Pastor Micah has identified a candidate for the new building superintendent position.** However, the candidate will not be able to join the staff immediately due to a sudden illness. We pray for his speedy recovery and will continue to use an outside cleaning service until further notice.

The Council unanimously approved a bylaws resolution to create a Committee for Justice and Peace. The resolution, which will be submitted for congregational approval during the February 2022 annual meeting, states: "There shall be a Committee for Justice and Peace to coordinate and lead the congregation's efforts to respond when there is injustice in our community, to leverage the privilege and power we have to create a just society, to accompany and empower disenfranchised communities, and to engage in deliberate self-reflection about our place in our community and in our system of power and privilege. The committee's work will complement the work of the Committee on Social Ministry, identifying areas of emphasis, and inviting the congregation to act together to build a world without injustice."

Immanuel has received a grant of \$60,441.74 from the American Gift Fund at the recommendation of the Roberts Charitable Fund. On behalf of the congregation, the council acknowledges and is deeply appreciative of the fund's generosity, and will work during the upcoming month to determine appropriate use(s) for the grant.




