
help put it together, but I think for many people, it's not the sort of thing we look forward to, like we might be eager for the coming of Christmas or Easter.

From the President



The Lenten season is nearly upon us! Ash Wednesday is February 26 and we begin our forty (40) days of reflection, repentance and contemplation. During this time, we are encouraged to replicate Jesus's sacrifice and withdrawal into the wilderness of Judea. We are to turn from sin and be faithful to the Gospel message. We are to resist temptations and rely on God above all else.

Jesus did not have to turn from sin like we do because he was the sinless Son of God. Not much is known about his "growing up" years, but we know that at about age thirty his

public ministry began. Jesus first was baptized by John the Baptist in the Jordan River. His baptism was an act of obedience to God's purposes. Soon after Jesus retreated to the Judaean wilderness to fast and to pray for forty days and forty nights. He was visited by Satan who tried to tempt him. Resisting those efforts, he traveled 128 miles to Galilee where he started preaching, gathering his apostles and doing his mission work. No easy life for Jesus! Traveling was much different back then, harder and very physically demanding.

When in the Holy Lands, I visited the Jordan River at a place called Qasr-El-Yehud, which, according to tradition, is the site where Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist. It is located about 77 miles south of



Nazareth, the hometown of Jesus. He would have walked there or, perhaps, ridden a donkey. The terrain is dry, dusty, sometimes flat and other times high mountains and low valleys. I was struck by how inhospitable the area was. Needless to say, there was little water besides the river. About 7 miles away was the Wadi Qelt; this is where we had our "wilderness" experience, starting with a short service and ending with ashes on our foreheads. Then over the next forty minutes we were left to meditate silently at a place we chose nearby.

It was so quiet there and not at all comfortable. The sun shone brightly. There was no shade. The mountains were steep and rocky, the valleys low. Walking was difficult. I tried to imagine Jesus during his forty days and forty nights there, wandering around alone, no food or water, defenseless. How did he survive? Jesus survived by relying on God above all else and being obedient to His will.

Dear Lord, may we rely on you above all else and be obedient to your will. In Jesus name we pray. Amen.
