There is at least one event already planned. Hint...see if you can find it elsewhere in this newsletter!

We chose "Tending Our Garden" because gardening is a good metaphor for thinking about our own growth in the Lord as individuals and our growth as a community of faith united in Jesus Christ.

Gardeners know the importance of preparing the garden after an extremely harsh winter. (I think we can all agree the past year of Covid-19 qualifies as an "extremely harsh" winter.) Preparation involves checking the beds, assessing damage, removing debris, and testing the soil, among other activities. Plans are made for the upcoming growing season, including plants to be removed, transplanted and pruned, and those to be grown from seeds and those to be purchased. Then there is the inevitable work of cultivating the soil, moving plantings for optimum sun and shade, planting the seeds, and preparing for the upkeep and overall care. 



WESTPORT MINISTRY IN HOUSING



They are planted in the house of the Lord; they flourish in the courts of our God.

PSALM 92:13

You might recognize the building in this photo – a 90-unit apartment building a few blocks from Immanuel on Mill Street, just off Southwest Trafficway. But you may not know its name – Westport House Apartments, home to people who need and appreciate our care.

Westport Ministry in Housing is a not-for-profit that owns and oversees the management of Westport House with a mission to provide elderly and handicapped persons safe and affordable housing. The organization was founded in 1983 by three Westport-area churches: Westport Presbyterian, St. Paul's Episcopal and Immanuel Lutheran, with members of each church serving on its board of directors. Karen Bame, Kathy Linder, Jean Nuernberger, Connie Ross, Rick Sundell and Marc Winkler currently represent Immanuel and provide guidance to ensure the continued success of the organization.

Westport House is more than subsidized housing. It provides a safe, caring environment that encourages interaction among residents. Westport Ministry in Housing is an example of the garden we have been tending at Immanuel for many years.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Highlights of the May 20, 2021, Council Meeting

•We're continuing to adapt worship processes to suit the local Covid-19 situation – The Pastor's Advisory Committee meets on 5/26 to review our current status and improvements to video and sound equipment for live streaming are ongoing.

•The Steering Committee has made significant progress on drafting a vision for a ministry document – The congregation will be encouraged to share reactions and feedback once the draft is shared in the coming months.

•Council approved the formation of a Justice and Peace Task Force which will coordinate and lead the congregation's efforts to respond to injustice in our world.
