


JAN. 6 EPIPHANY SERVICE TELLS THE STORY OF THE MAGI

YOU CAN SUPPORT A CHILD IN NEED THROUGH THE KENYAN CHILDREN'S FUND

For almost 10 years, the Kenyan Children's Fund (KCF), which is Immanuel's global mission project, has helped meet the basic needs of children in Masii, Kenya, who have been orphaned by HIV/AIDS and are living in deep poverty.

Providing water, food and more

Jimmi Kimuyu, an Immanuel member and KCF founder now residing in Masii, says, "In Kenya, we are experiencing drought and famine, and many needy families are suffering. The people of Masii are deeply grateful for the well that KCF funded, which provides 7,000 area residents with water that is safe to drink."

Jimmi adds that gratitude for all that your generosity has allowed KCF to accomplish flows far beyond the water well.

"With your donations, we provide muchneeded monthly food supplements and some household products — including maize, beans, rice, flour, soap and cooking oil — for 45 children and their guardians," he explains. He adds that, during 2021, KCF also has:

- Purchased required school uniforms for very needy children.
- Constructed a bathroom for girls at the local primary school, where only a boy's bathroom had previously existed. The bathroom allows girls to stay for the entire school day.
- Repaired the badly damaged roofs of several structures in which sponsored children and their guardians reside.



Monthly food supplements provide crucial nourishment to orphans and their guardians. The KCF also was able to provide some extra food for Christmas.

Jimmi adds that, with your generosity, the KCF also may be able to fund additional needs. "We hope to provide mattresses for children who now sleep on dirt floors. Assistance with school fees, and money to purchase a truck to transport food and building-repair materials also are greatly needed," he explains.

Jimmi speaks for everyone associated with the KCF when he says: "We simply can't thank you enough. May almighty God abundantly bless you and keep you. In the words of Psalm 41, 'Blessed is he who has regard for the weak; the Lord delivers him in times of trouble. The Lord will protect him and preserve his life; he will bless him in the land and not surrender him to the desire of his foes.' "

NEWS FROM YOUR CONGREGATION COUNCIL



Citing concerns about the Omicron variant, Immanuel's COVID-19 Advisory Committee recommends that Immanuel's current health and safety guidelines remain in place as is. Advisory Committee members also have opened discussions with YouthWorks about how young volunteers who stay in our

building this summer will remain safe and healthy.

Terry Kueker shared that staff and volunteers of Metro Lutheran Ministry and Immanuel both consider the 2021 Christmas Store a success. Although final results aren't yet in, the store served a minimum of 1,000 families and perhaps as many as 1,300. During a meeting with MLM staff and volunteers in early January, Immanuel hosts will suggest ways to relieve parking congestion and confusion. The council extends heartfelt thanks to all Immanuel volunteers who participated in the store, with special recognition to this year's hosts: Milan Hanson, Beth Callstrom, and Terry and Lori Kueker.

As of Dec. 26, the Stewardship Committee reports receiving 46 commitment pledges totaling \$208,200. Based on those responses and past budgetary experience, the 2022 Immanuel budget likely will forecast \$288,000 in total-year offerings.
