For some of us, who have walked this path many times before, it's familiar. We know every step. For some of us, who might never have embarked on this journey before, it's intimidating and frightening. Our footing isn't as sure, our certainty in the resolution that lies ahead might be more clouded, finding it hard to see the empty tomb on the other side of the cross. All of us walk this path together, though. We don't tell this story alone, but in a chorus, a story told in the voice of all the saints from every time and place.

As we return again to this chapter in our sacred story, I invite you to listen, not just to the story itself, but to the voices of all who are telling it. We share this story with all of God's children, each of us both teacher and student. In this Lenten season, I pray that we might learn from each other, hearing anew this ancient story.

THE LONELINESS OF GRIEF

When we grieve, we mourn the loss of something or someone personal, an experience that is both intimate and private. The author of Psalm 25 names this feeling head-on in verse 16. "Turn to me and be gracious to me, for I am lonely and afflicted." As blogger and griever Jodi Whitsitt says, "As it turns out, grief lasts longer than sympathy–way longer." The loneliness of grief is extended when the mourner perceives that others have moved on. People who once were there with tissues and hugs might not understand why we still need their support. Psalm 25 may serve two purposes: first, to help grieving people know that they are not alone–the psalmists understand their loneliness; and second, to help those who would comfort the grievers be attentive not just to grief, but to its persistence, and to the loneliness of those who are suffused by grief.

This message is an excerpt from Session 2 of the Bible study, "No Hard Feelings" by Anna Madsen in the October 2019 issue of Gather magazine.

While the search for a new Treasurer continues, other open positions became filled as people heeded the call for volunteers to serve. These included:



BWV 150

"Nach dir, Herr, verlanget mich" (O my Lord, I long for thee)

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER APRIL 26TH 7:00 PM

The famous portraits of J.S. Bach show him as serious, bewigged and middle-aged, making it difficult for most of us to imagine him as a younger man. He seems to be portrayed almost as if he had sprung forth fully formed as composer, father of twenty children and tamer of countless unruly boy choristers. For our next Bach Cantata Vespers on April 26th at 7:00 p.m., we will have a musical window on the younger Herr Bach.

Composed sometime between 1704 – 1707, Cantata 150 is considered to be Bach's earliest surviving church cantata. These dates put our composer between the ages of 19 and 22. Unlike most of his cantatas, this work uses no chorale melodies, but instead the movements are unified by their use of musical motives and text. Movements alternate verses from Psalm 25 with thematically related poetry.

Given the early date of this cantata, it might also be interesting to note some events in Bach's life from this time. There are records from August of 1705 in Arnstadt, where young Johann had gotten in trouble with his employer. The charges included accusations that he had been given permission to be away for four weeks to hear Buxtehude play but had stayed away four months. He had taken a 'young woman' into the organ loft. (This young woman later became his first wife.) He had also gotten into a street fight with bassoonist. The bassoonist hit Bach first, but he claimed that Bach had insulted him by calling him a "Zippel-fagottist." This can be this translated as

"Nannygoat-bassoonist", "Onion-bassoonist", and other less polite terms. It is interesting to note that Cantata 150 has an unusually prominent bassoon part.

I hope that you will join us in April for this next Bach Cantata Vespers!
