November is a season of endings.

The nights get colder and longer, trees go from colorful to barren, and the year draws to a close. We mark All Saints Day, remembering our beloved dead. We gather in our harvests, either literally or metaphorically, and celebrate with a great Thanksgiving feast before the long, lean winter months.

When we gather in worship, we hear a similar refrain that echoes the anxiety of the season. The lectionary takes on an apocalyptic tone, and we hear warning from scripture about hardships and calamities. It can be a dismal time of year.

It can also be a time for new beginnings.

Crops that can be harvested in spring take root in fall. When the nights are long and the skies clear of summer haze, we see the stars more clearly. There's no certainty in this, of course; our asparagus might not grow like we plan, and cloudy skies might block our view of the heavens. But there is always hope.

A few years ago, we held a series of midweek Advent gatherings during which we made up stories together through an activity called "The End." Beginning with disasters of various kinds, everyone who gathered around the table imagined what it would be like to live through the end of life as we know it. The experience led to some powerful moments, in large part because it required us to build something new out of the ashes of what had ended.

I hope to engage all who are interested in something similar this year. I'm still searching for the right set of "rules" to guide our thinking and imagining, but the plan is to gather via Zoom at 7 p.m. each Wednesday evening during Advent, beginning Dec. 1. This year, I'm aiming for a theme of kindling hope in the face of hardship. All are welcome to participate, even if you've never heard of this type of activity before. If you're interested or if you have questions, please let me know!

As many things draw to an end, I'm eager to see what new beginnings God has in store for us.

WORSHIP IN PERSON OR ONLINE



NEWS FROM YOUR CONGREGATION COUNCIL



Brian Thomas created a financial trend analysis for 2017-present that, overall, indicates a consistent flow of income and expenses.

Events with notable budgetary impact include the renegotiation of the

mortgage loan to lower Immanuel's expenses, and the 2020 and 2021 Payroll Protection Plan loans, which provided additional income. The 2020 loan was forgiven in 2021, and the 2021 should be forgiven in 2022.

Currently, the full-year budget projection indicates that Immanuel will end 2021 with a \$19,600 deficit, which is a considerable improvement compared with the \$118,000 year-end deficit that had been anticipated a few months ago.

Thank you to Brian for the analysis, to Kate Hauber for helping to renegotiate the mortgage loan, and to Kathy Linder for providing information that leads to forgiveness of the Payroll Protection Plan loans.

Pastor Micah is working with a consultant to explore purchasing up-to-date, refurbished computers and network equipment. The new equipment will enable the church office to reduce costs, increase capabilities and keep Immanuel's data secure.

Council members have reviewed the Vision for Ministry statement created by the Immanuel Steering Committee. It will be implemented after it is circulated to the congregation for comments and revised accordingly. Many thanks to the steering committee for its thoughtful work.
