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Ocular Drug Limitations

- Drug washout and dilution
- Significant anatomic barriers
 - Tear Film
 - Cornea
 - Conjunctiva
 - Sclera
 - Blood-Eye Barrier
- Species specific variables



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Topical Antibiotics

- Indications
 - All corneal ulcers
 - Bacterial conjunctivitis
 - Post-op patients
- Antibiotic formulations
 - Drops
 - Ointments
- Treatment frequency considerations



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Topical Antibiotics

- Antibiotic susceptibility
 - Culture results
 - Spectrum
- Antibiotic selection
- Special considerations



Drugs on a Shelf: Antibiotics

Drug Class	Ocular Drugs	Gram Spectrum	Mechanism	Special Notes
Aminoglycoside	Gentamicin Tobramycin Neomycin	-	Inhibit 16S ribosome subunit	Gentamicin best for Moraxella bovis
Macrolide	Erythromycin	+	Inhibit 50S ribosome subunit	Resistance to macrolides correlates with resistance to methicillin
Tetracycline	Oxytetracycline	-	Inhibit 30S ribosome subunit	Terramycin includes polymyxin B
Fluoroquinolones	Ofloxacin Ciprofloxacin Moxifloxacin	-/+	DNA Gyrase Inhibitor (topoisomerase II +/- IV)	Ciprofloxacin: crystal precipitate Later generations = increased Gram + activity
Polypeptide	Bacitracin	+	Permeates cell membrane	No transcorneal penetration NeoPolyBac is only ointment
Polymyxin	Polymyxin B Gramicidin	- +	Disrupts cell membrane and neutralizes LPS	Polymyxin B Feline anaphylaxis NeoPolyGram is drop
Cephalosporins	Cefazolin	+	Interfere with cell wall enzymes	Compounded from injectable in artificial tears
Amphenicol	Chloramphenicol	+	Binds 50S ribosome subunit	Aplastic anemia (1:1,000,000)



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Topical Antibiotics

- What drugs to keep on hand
 - Ofloxacin
 - Tobramycin
 - Erythromycin
 - Cefazolin injectable (1 gram) + Artificial Tears
- +/- NeoPolyBacitracin



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Topical Anti-inflammatories


- What drug classes are available?
 - Steroids
 - NSAIDs
 - Calcineurin inhibitors (more on these later)

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Topical Anti-inflammatories

- What drugs are available?
 - Steroids
 - Hydrocortisone
 - Dexamethasone
 - Prednisolone Acetate
 - NSAIDs
 - Diclofenac
 - Ketorolac
 - Flurbiprofen
 - Bromfenac*



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Topical Anti-inflammatories

- Complications
 - Steroids
 - Crystalline corneal degeneration
 - Ocular hypertension?
 - Polyuria/polydipsia/polyphagia
 - Hyperglycemia
 - NSAIDs
 - Ocular hypertension?
 - GI ulcers, vomiting, diarrhea?
 - Inhibits platelet function




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Topical Anti-inflammatories

 - Surface
 - Anterior Segment
 - Posterior Segment

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Topical Glaucoma Medications

- Carbonic Anhydrase Inhibitors
- Available drugs
 - Dorzolamide
 - Brinzolamide
- Frequency
 - BID-TID
- Complications
 - Stinging on application
 - Keratitis



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Topical Glaucoma Medications

- Beta-Blockers
- Available drugs
 - Timolol
 - Betaxalol
- Frequency
 - BID-TID
- Complications
 - Bradycardia
 - Asthma (feline)



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Topical Glaucoma Medications

- Prostaglandin Analogues
- Available drugs
 - Latanoprost
 - Travaprost
- Frequency
 - BID-TID
- Complications
 - Pupil constriction
 - Induce uveitis



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Topical Glaucoma Medications

- Osmotic Agents
- Available drugs
 - Mannitol
 - Glycerin
- Complications



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Topical Glaucoma Medications

- Primary Glaucoma
 - Dorzolamide +/- Timolol
 - Latanoprost
- Safest bet
 - Dorzolamide



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Tear Film

- Tear Supplements
 - Artificial Tears
 - Drops
 - Gels
 - Ointments
 - Tear Stimulants
 - Calcineurin-inhibitor
 - Cyclosporine
 - Tacrolimus
 - mTOR inhibitor (Rapamycin)
 - Sirolimus
