Parking



NNU Supporters are Upset Nurses Don't Get Reduced Rate/Free Parking.

The NNU supporters are correct, parking on the JHH campus is expensive, and can be inconvenient. Let's break this down.

- Parking in Baltimore City is expensive. The Well's Fargo Building parking garage on St. Paul's Street charges \$28/day. Monthly permit parkers pay \$238/month.
- Baltimore City charges 20% of gross receipts for parking lots and garages.¹
- The owners of the garages are responsible to pay their staff and maintain the structure (Johns Hopkins Hospital does not own the lots or garages).
- The parking rate in an on-campus JHH garage is \$12/day*. JHH Nurses pay \$120/month (pre-tax). Essentially, nurses pay for parking for 10 days per month. Eight-hour full-time staff work 20 days per month. Ten hour full-time staff work 16 days per month. Twelve-hour full time staff work 12 days per month. Essentially, ALL full-time JHH nurses are receiving a discount for parking. (*Off campus satellite parking is less)

NNU Supporters Have Asked Why Can't We Park Where We Want if We Have to Pay to Park?

Yes, you are paying to park and yes, are assigned a garage/lot in which you must park. As stated above, you are actually paying a lower rate than our patients, their families, and other visitors.

Most importantly, the reason why parking locations for staff needs to be regulated is because we are here for OUR PATIENTS! None of us would have a job if not for the patients in our care. We need to be sure they and their families have the easiest time possible in getting into the building.
