### Show Me the Money

NNU has made a point of sharing the salaries of executives at Johns Hopkins. What does that really mean?

- In a federally required tax documents known as a 990, Hopkins executive compensation for FY 2014 was 0.2% of total expenses<sup>1</sup>.

Notable expenses		Percent of total expenses
Executive compensation	\$4,429,901	0.2%
Professional fundraising fees	\$0	
Other salaries and wages	\$553,250,538	28.7%

- Percentage based on total functional expenses found on 990 of \$2,046,127,067\*.

### What about NNU?

- NNU is federally required to file a tax document known as a LM2. Net distributions to officers in NNU for FY2014 was 0.7% of total expenses.

Form LM-2 (Revised 2010)

- Percentage based on a total net asset amount on LM2 of \$25,601,686

\*The images above are screen shots from the respective documents. To ensure equality in the information, the percentage of total expenses for JHH was calculated based on total net asset amount found on the 990 report (as the LM2 does for NNU) of \$1,289, 467,341. This is 0.3% of total expenses, which is still significantly less than the NNU is spending for officers.
