Personal Information

NNU says it supports work/life balance yet they are reaching out to me at my home on my non-work time.

- Staff at Johns Hopkins have begun to receive letters to their homes and personal e-mail addresses, post-marked from California, containing pro-union material.
- It is also possible that staff will begin to receive personal visits from NNU supporters at their homes during their valuable family time.

How did they get my personal information?

- We know some personal contact information was obtained from your own pro-NNU co-workers who shared unit resources such as disaster trees.
- For some, it came from attendance at a union meeting or signing a union card.
- Personal information is available for sale on the open and black market. While we cannot say definitively that NNU bought your contact information, we know they have the resources to do so.

- We have used JHH email addresses, available to all staff through Outlook, to contact staff at work because the result of this campaign will influence our working conditions. We do not have access to a JHH list-serve
