TOWN OF MAPLE LAKE, MINNESOTA ORDINANCE NO. 2001 - 1

ORDINANCE PROHIBITING LIGHTING OF NEIGHBORING PROPERTY

The Town Board for the Maple Lake Township, Wright County, Minnesota, hereby ordains as follows:

Section 1. Regulation of Outdoor Lights. Any outdoor light or combination of lights which cast light on residential property other than the property upon which said lights are located shall not exceed four (4) foot candles (meter reading) as measured from the neighboring property. The source of such lights shall be hooded or controlled in some manner so as not to light neighboring property. Bare incandescent light bulbs shall not be permitted in view of adjacent property.

<u>Section 2. Penalty</u>. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) and/or by imprisonment not to exceed ninety (90) days, or both.

Passed by the Town Board of the Maple Lake Township this 19th day of December, 2000.

This ordinance shall be effective upon passage and publication in the official Township newspaper.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 2008-1

Regulating - Spring, Summer, Fall, parking and ditch Mowing.

- 1. No person shall park any unattended vehicle or object on Town road or right-ofway from April 1st to November 1st.
- 2. Impoundment Any vehicle or object may be removed from Town road or right-of-way to an impound lot or other place of safety it left unattended and constitutes an obstruction to traffic or other road maintenance operations. Such vehicle or object shall not be released until fee for towing and storage is paid in addition to any fine imposed for violation of this ordinance.
- 3. Road Obstruction No person shall deposit any obstruction onto a Town road right-of-way that would endanger regular road traffic or Town maintenance equipment when mowing ditches. This includes the planting of trees or any other vegetation on Town right-of-way
