



7-Day Devotional Plan: Steps to Seek Deliverance

Overview

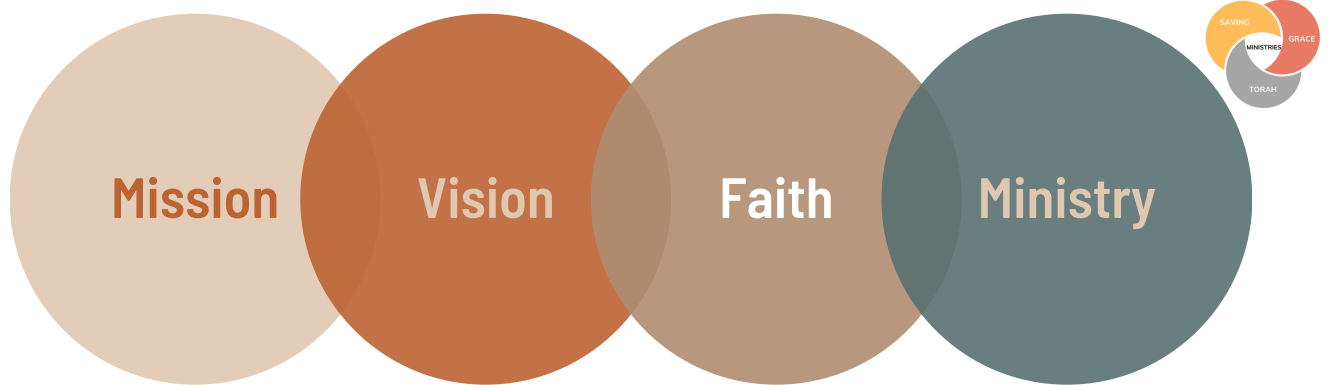
This 7-Day Devotional Plan on Steps to Seek Deliverance guides believers through a journey of repentance, renewal, and restoration in Yahshua. Each day focuses on a practical and spiritual step: repenting and renouncing, setting boundaries, seeking accountability, fasting with prayer, and filling the empty places with Scripture, worship, and service. Through daily reflections, Scriptures, and prayers, the plan equips you to walk in lasting freedom and guard your heart against returning bondage. By the end of the week, you will stand firm in Yahweh's promises and move forward with confidence in His delivering power.

Day 1: A Cry for Deliverance	Day 2: Repent and Renounce
Scripture Reading: Psalm 34:17 Reflection: Deliverance begins with an honest cry. Yahweh does not ignore the prayers of those who call on Him with sincerity. Recognize that you cannot free yourself by human strength alone. Freedom comes when you admit your need and invite Yahshua to intervene. Prayer: Yahweh my Deliverer, I cry out to You today. Hear my voice and see my heart. Break every chain that binds me and lead me into Your freedom. In Yahshua's name, So Be It.	Scripture Reading: 1 John 1:9 Reflection: Repentance is the turning of your heart back to Yahweh. Renouncing unbiblical ties breaks agreement with the enemy. Speak boldly in Yahshua's Name and declare freedom. Confession and renunciation are not rituals; they are declarations of spiritual authority. Prayer: Father, I repent for every sinful tie and attachment. In Yahshua's Name, I renounce and break them. Cleanse me from all unrighteousness and renew my spirit. In Yahshua's name, So Be It.
Day 3: Boundaries that Guard Freedom	Day 4: Strength in Accountability
Scripture Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:33 Reflection: Freedom requires vigilance. Establishing boundaries means removing access points and refusing compromise. Guard your heart as diligently as you would guard a treasure. Boundaries are not restrictions, but safeguards that preserve the liberty Yahweh has given. Prayer: Abba, help me set boundaries that honor You. Give me courage to cut ties with every trigger and access point. Keep me steadfast in the freedom You have provided. In Yahshua's name, So Be It.	Scripture Reading: James 5:16 Reflection: Deliverance is reinforced by community. A mature believer brings encouragement, wisdom, and covering. Accountability keeps you from isolation, where the enemy seeks to weaken you. Healing flows when we walk in transparency with trusted brothers and sisters. Prayer: Yahweh, place in my life mature believers who will walk with me. Help me to receive their guidance and remain open to correction. Let their prayers strengthen me in my journey. In Yahshua's name, So Be It.
Day 5: Fasting with Prayer for Breakthrough	Day 6: Filling the Empty Places

Scripture Reading: Matthew 17:21 Reflection: Fasting is a spiritual weapon that humbles the body and elevates the spirit. Combined with prayer, it creates space for Yahweh to act in power. It is not a ritual of deprivation but a posture of dependence. Breakthrough often comes when flesh is silenced, and the spirit is attuned to heaven. Prayer: Yahweh my Strength, I humble myself in fasting and prayer. Quiet my flesh and sharpen my spirit. Bring breakthrough where I cannot break through alone. In Yahshua's name, So Be It.	Scripture Reading: Colossians 3:16 Reflection: An empty soul is vulnerable. Yahshua taught that when unclean spirits depart, they seek to return if the house is unfilled. Fill your life with Scripture, worship, and service. By doing so, you become a vessel overflowing with Yahweh's presence, leaving no room for darkness to return. Prayer: Father, fill me with Your Word, saturate me with Your Spirit, and use me in service to others. May my life overflow with worship and truth. Seal me in Your presence, leaving no place for the enemy. In Yahshua's name, So Be It.
Day 7: Walking in Lasting Freedom	
Scripture Reading: Galatians 5:1 Reflection: Deliverance is not only an event but a lifestyle. The freedom Yahshua gives must be guarded, nurtured, and lived daily. Stand firm in His promises, knowing that what He has begun in you, He will complete. Walk forward boldly, confident that your deliverance is secure in Him. Prayer: Eternal Elohim our Father Yahweh, thank You for setting me free in Yahshua. Teach me to walk daily in the liberty You have provided. Keep me steadfast and unshaken, so that I may live as a testimony of Your delivering power. In Yahshua's name, So Be It.
