# **Mitigation Measure Monitoring**

In comparison to the last update, Mt. View-Edgewood Water Company (MTVE) has no new projects and is continuing the mitigation strategies as seen in the table below.

Since the last update, MTVE completed 7 of the mitigation measures listed in the previous update. The largest capital cost project was a seismic retrofit of two existing steel water reservoirs. 6 of the mitigation measures are ongoing measures that will never be completed and done.

During the annual budgeting process, MTVE reviews this mitigation list to determine if any of the projects should be completed the following year. Mitigation projects are prioritized with other potential capital projects to determine which ones should be completed. Projects are selected if they are high enough on the priority list and MTVE has the finances available to complete the project. MTVE also creates a financial forecaster that identifies capital projects over the next 10 years. Current mitigation projects on the forecaster are a generator for Well 9, replacement of asbestos mains, and other water main upgrade projects.

In 2020 MTVE one mitigation project that will be completed is the purchase and installation of a new generator for Well 9 and the relocation of the current Well 9 generator to Well 7. We will also be completing some water main upgrades in 2020.

2 of the continuing measures (Puyallup Intertie and Wells 1R & 8 site mitigation) from the previous update are projects that are not scheduled for completion and may be removed from the list in the next update. The Puyallup intertie was based on the City of Puyallup constructing a reservoir on property the City owned within our service area. While the City of Puyallup still owns the property, the plans to construct a reservoir on it have been put on hold. Without the reservoir an intertie is not financially feasible or beneficial to MTVE. For the Wells 1R & 8 site mitigation project, the City installed some ecology blocks on the hillside that has helped stabilize the slope. More expensive, permanent methods are not needed at this time.
