LAWS AND POLICIES

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State and local lawmakers throughout the U.S. have taken action to prevent bullying and protect children. While each jurisdiction or state addresses bullying differently, most action requires districts and schools to implement a bullying policy and procedures to investigate and respond when it occurs. Some states also reguler bullying prevention programs, inclusion of bullying prevention in health education standards and/or teacher professional development. While these laws openerally do not prescribe specific consequences for kids who engage in bullying behavior, and very few classify bullying as a criminal offerinse, the states may address bullying, cyberbullying and related behaviors in a single law or across multiple laws. In some cases, bullying appears in state criminal codes that may apply to juveniles.


BULLYING BY THE NUMBERS

Frequency of bullying


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


Types of power imbalance in bullying
