Letter from our President, Mary Sorrells


Dear Members:

Guild Project

Janet Newman will demo how to make gourd iewelry. Pre-cut shapes will be available along with a variety of embellishments. Pieces will be cleaned, sanded, and painted or stained. Different threads and fibers will be available to weave around the gourd pieces. Different techniques for weaving around the edges will be shown.

A variety of beads will be available to enhance your new piece of iewelry. Pieces can be finished into a pin or necklace. Two

gourd pieces plus all necessary embellishments can be purchased for \$5. Additional gourd pieces can be purchased for \$3.
