Weaving tips From The Guild Meeting

Weavers for round reed spokes weave best if they are at least 1 size smaller.

Karen Scott taught a round reed basket that used several techniques. The newest is "fitching". It is exciting-guess we'll have to do this again.

Seat weaving has its perils. A chair that hasn't been properly shaped, will have split weavers when used for the first time. This is not pretty at all! Wet the seat. Apply pressure to shape the seat for a human bottom. Fix broken spokes before applying stain.
