

- Add 33 stakes into the 3" slotted base evenly spaced. Start by inserting 4 dyed stakes " at four corner points on base, mark with pencil.
- Fill in 8 stakes between each section (32). The last spoke will be added when the spokes are upset to give an odd number of spokes enabling a continuous weave.
- Using waxed linen twine for three rows around stakes at base line.



- Upset the stakes so that they form over the PVC pipe.
- Begin the weave with a tapered dyed 1/4" FO color of your choice for 6" begin two/ two continuous twill for the duration of the basket.
- 6) When you reach approximately 8" insert the handle into the basket and weave with it as part of the stakes. This method is MUCH easier than waiting until the end of the basket to insert the handle on wet weave.
- Weave until you reach the 11" marker then taper the row to finish.
- Scarf the ends of 1/2" FO for rims overlapping at least one inch for inner rim and outer rim.
- Make a rim sandwich with two rims (inner/outer) and seagrass for the rim filler. Using tie wraps secure every fourth stake.
- 10)Lash with waxed linen.

Materials required:
3" slotted round base
33-1/4" flat oval stakes @24"
Waxed linen twine and
lashing
1/2" FR for rim
2" bushel handle

PVC pipe for mold 4"
