#### We Weave with Giants

We have so many exceptionally talented individuals in the Oklahoma Guild. One of our members recently won a very unexpected award. Kathryn Kelly participated in a show at the Cherokee Casino at Catoosa called Indian Market. It was the casino's first Indian Market and featured 160 Indian artists from all over the United States. Kathryn was honored with first runner-up in the Contemporary

division. According to Bob, Kathryn's husband, it was a great show with some real quality art. A banquet for all the artists and family was held in the ballroom at the Cherokee Lodge. All the winners that won prizes had their work displayed around the ball room.

In 2003 Kathryn, was honored by the Cherokee Nation with the reward of National Living Treasure/Cherokee Master Craftsperson in the traditional art of Basketry. Kathryn is a member of the Cherokee Nation and speaks the Cherokee language.

Kathryn began basket weaving in 1986 after retiring from 30 years of teaching school. The Cherokee double wall is her favorite. She uses honeysuckle vines to weave the double wall basket. Her baskets have found homes all over the United States, and also in England, Scotland and Russia.

Kathryn, we are very proud of you! If you ever get a chance to take a class from Kathryn don't miss the opportunity. You will have a fabulous basket from a great instructor.

#### Loaves and Letters

#### Materials:

3/8" flat reed, cut 9 pcs @ 15" - spokes

3/8" flat reed, cut 5 pcs @ 20" - spokes


3/8" flat reed, cut 1 pc @ 36" (rim row)

1/4" flat reed (weavers)

1/4" flat oval reed, 2 pieces @ 15" (handles)

1/2" flat oval reed (rim)

3/16" flat reed or your preference (lasher)

Mark centers on all cut spokes on the wrong side. Lay out the 20" spokes horizontally and weave one of the 15" spokes across the center, weaving under one/over one across the center. Weave the remainder of the 15" spokes with 4 on each side of the center spoke. Adjust base to measure 4-3/4" x 8-3/4". Even out the spokes to insure equal spacing and square up the base.

With 1/4" flat reed, weave a keeper row around the perimeter.

Upset the spokes and weave 5 start/stop rows with 1/4" flat reed to form the sides.

Weave a rim row with the 3/8" flat reed.

Tuck all outside spokes and cut off all inside spokes.

Form handles on the ends with the 1/4" flat oval reed by pushing the ends down under two weavers and pulling the tails into the basket. Twist the flat oval reed to form the handle shape so that the flat side is facing the same direction on both ends of the handle. Bend the ends up and tuck the ends back up under one row to tie in the handles. Cut off the excess length.

Rim with 1/2" flat oval reed, both inside and outside.

Add rim filler and lash with 3/16" flat reed or cane.

Finishing finish with a criss-cross pattern. Slide a piece of 1/4" flat reed in diagonally between the horizontal and vertical spokes at each place that they intersect, first one direction and then the opposite diagonal direction to form the crosses in the base. This also acts as filler for the base.
