Meeting adjourned at 12:48 p.m.


Baskets were finished! This basket was designed by Marcia to fit requested criteria.

The Josephine Knot is an elegant knot that looks best in long, lacy designs with many strands. This knot is very distinctive and unique looking.

- 1. Make a loop with the left strands.
- 2. Place the right strands ov this loop and then slide the right strands behind the left loose strand ends,
- 3. Slide the strand ends over the top left strands and weave the strand diagonally across the loop.
- 4. Tighten the knot evenly.
- This know looks very beautiful with done with multiple cords as well.



The picture to the left is from Pinterest.com and is an excellent example of a Josephine knot made into a basket. I was not able to find the name of the person who made this wonderful example. Look close and you can see that beads are added to the reed next to the pink threads.

The Josephine know is also called the Carrick bend knot and was used for joining two lines. It is also called the Pretzel knot.
