Retreat Committee Report:

Report was given by Pat Horsey since Janet Newman was absent. This year the selection committee consisted of Jewel Cowan, Margaret Smith, Mary Garnett, Mike and Linda Tickle and I. I did not vote. The first round of selection is done without knowing the instructor, just a picture and description of the basket. They selected a keep or no keep. The ones with the highest 2 rating were selected for the retreat. The rest of the selections were to fill in the time frame for weaving. Having 116 baskets to select from, the committee decided to start classes on Friday at 1pm. The committee selected 47 baskets and 14 instructors. There will be 4 new instructors this year. There will be no Potluck dinner for Friday, but one sign up for Friday dinner with the registration. The lodge rooms will be first come basis. Would like to have at least 3 persons in a room. The retreat will offer a long sleeved navy blue T shirt for the first time. It will be embroidery with our logo and the year on it. The shirt may be ordered at the time of registration. The guild pays for instructor's lodging and meals. There will be 3 vendors. A side note, I had a call from Jill Choates to submit baskets for our retreat but it was 2 weeks post closing.

Old Business:

Beginners Class has 30 individuals signed up for today.

Web site: Marcia Balleweg has spoken to Pat Felt, the lady who handles our web site. The guild needs a new server by April. Marcia had three servers for the guild to look at. The guild selected Go Daddy. The cost is \$5.94/month. We will do a 3 year contract. Marcia will make the changes. She also suggested adding to our web site a list of instructors with contact information. Margaret Smith suggested adding pictures of our last retreat and other events the guild has done. No motions were made.

Positive Tomorrows: We received a very nice thank you letter from them for our donation of baskets. New Business:

Beginner's Class: Linda Tickle informed the guild that she and Pat Horsey have done the Beginner's Class for the last 4 years. Next year would like to have another committee take over. She also suggested having more than one Beginner class a year and maybe offer an intermediate class for a fee. Tabled to next meeting.

Marcia Balleweg suggested doing our beginners and other similar classes on off guild Saturdays. Linda Tickle will include an article in the newsletter.

Marcia Balleweg announced that Billy Owen will be teaching at her shop. Check her web site if interested. Billy has 2 morning open slots and 1 for afternoon.



Our May project is a market basket for **Positive Tomorrows**. This is an organization that helps abused women when they start a new life on their own. They are given a basket made by the Guild that is full of kitchen items. A pattern will be provided courtesy of Suzanne Moore's NC Basket Works. You bring the supplies and weave the basket at the Guild meeting. Take the basket home and fill it with kitchen items and bring it back to the July meeting. It will be wrapped in cellophane and a tag will be attached that says it was donated by the BasketWeavers Guild of Oklahoma. Please bring all supplies for your basket to the meeting. If you need an 8" x 12" D Handle or colored reed, you can order it from Oklahoma Basket Supply. Contact Marcia Balleweg at 405-356-2224. Please contact me at 405-789-4540 if you need the natural reed to make the basket, so you do not have to buy full coils. There will be a small fee for the natural reed. I will bring the natural reed and an assortment of leaves to decorate your baskets. The baskets can be any color. They do not have to be Autumn. If you get the chance, please **thank Suzanne Moore** for letting us use her pattern. **Thank you also Janet, for the article.**

Materials

8 X 12 'D' handle

1/4" FF - dyed rust and gold

1/4" FF - natural-lacing & rim row

1/2" FF - dyed medium brown

2 Painted Metal Autumn Leaves for front of

basket*

1/2" FF - natural for weavers

3/4" FF - spokes

Seagrass - rim filler

1/2" FO - rims

#2R brown to connect leaves (optional)

Cut 8 spokes from ¾" FF each 28" long and 7 spokes from ¾" FF each 30" long. Soak briefly. Mark the center of the handle and a few of the spokes.

Lay 3 spokes horizontal (30" long) <u>under</u> the handle and 4 on top of the handle. Weave in vertically 4 spokes on each side of handle. Base measures $8" \times 10"$. Upset the spokes. Weave the following rows start and stop.

1 row 1/2" FF brown (this will be **outside** the handle)

1 row ¼" FF rust

1 row ¼' FF gold

9 rows ½" FF natural

1 row ¼" gold

1 row ¼' F rust

1 row 1/2" FF brown

Pack well. Cut and tuck in the usual manner. Rim with $\frac{1}{2}$ " FO, seagrass between rims, and lash with $\frac{1}{4}$ " FF.
