

The Shakers were prolific weavers in early America and designed this basket, known as the "Cat's head" because of the manner in which it is woven creates little "legs". When flipped upside down it looks like the head of a cat with little ears. The project for our April 20th meeting will be learning to weave a cathead basket using natural and black reed. The technique is a challenge and if it is your first cathead

basket you may not be totally happy with the result; but you will learn the technique and with practice you can improve your technique. The rim looks a little like a Wretched Gretchen, but it is not. It is a 3-rod wale that looks like a Gretchen, so it is easy to weave.

MAMMOTH CAVE BASKET from Feb.

Those of you who want to finish your Mammoth Cave Basket (from the Feb. meeting) you should bring the basket and reed to the April meeting.

After you have woven the cat legs on your cathead basket you will know how to finish on your own and can finish at home. Then Mary will show you how to

finish the rim on your Mammoth Cave basket.

Please have the sides of your Mammoth Cave basket

woven to the rim upon arrival.

It is a lot of work to color and cut reed for these projects and our volunteers/teachers need the time and funds to cover costs ahead of time. We ask that you only request ONE kit per offering to weave at the meeting.






Weaving at OU School of Architecture

In March Marcia, Nancy, and Mary spent 6 afternoons teaching a large group of University of Oklahoma architecture students to weave round and flat reed. The Freshmen students were taken to the National Weather Center in Norman and taught the science of different kinds of storms. The assignment was to then pick a storm, i.e. tornado, hurricane, lightning, etc. and create a physical structure using reed and the weaving skills that they learned to depict the science of the storm. After they learned weaving skills, they had the rest of the semester to create their model. We returned at the summation of the project to help critique their models.

It was fascinating and as you will see in the photos, the students were creative and resourceful.

Can you tell which ones were the tornados? The hurricanes? The lightning storms? Do you see some that are actually examples of art?

The students were young, energetic, curious, friendly, and SMART; so, they were a pleasure to teach. Maybe some will someday want to weave baskets like we do. The other thing we got out of the experience was --- their generation is going to do great things. It was encouraging!
