Be sure to go online and get registered to enter your best baskets made this year in the fair. When you go to the fair website go to Creative Arts Contests. Print out the guidelines. Then go and register as an Exhibitor. The Basket entries category number is 3521. Look for that number and you can find Basket Weaving easier. You can enter 2 baskets in Traditional and 2 baskets in Non-Traditional. There are different categories in the two classes.

Remember to let Marcia Balleweg know if you want to be a part of the basket weaving demo at the fair on September 15th from 1 to 5. She will see that you get a ticket to enter the fair free and a pass to park in special exhibitor parking that is a lot closer. You can come when the fair opens to walk and eat all you want, them demo from



1 to 5 and then take in the even events all with the same free ticket. Can't beat that.

The demo is a great time to gather names and addresses of people for our beginner's class. So be sure to let Marcia know you want to be a part of the demo so she can get your tickets to you early.
