

3 ½" wide at the top

9" long and 4"high without handle.

All weaving levels

Good seller for craft shows

This quickly woven little basket is fun to make. and can hold a lot despite it's size. What a good way to use your left over reed from other projects as you design each row. Choose to add colors or keep it plain. What a nice addition to any décor also a nice gift to give.

# Material:

3/4" flat reed-spokes
Scrap of 3mm-base binder row
Assorted reed sizes- weavers
#10 round reed-handle
1/2" flat reed- rim-24" long
1/4" flat reed- rim lasher-63" long
Sea Grass - rim filler

Preparation & Base:

Cut 2 side base spokes 22" long with ¾" flat Cut 7 front/back spokes 15" long with ¾" flat Weavers are approximately 24" long Handle will be 11 ½" long (cut notches 2 ½" up from each end, soak well, shape into a "U" and insert into second spoke on each side of back)

Place the 2 side spokes horizontally weave in the 7 front/back spokes vertically centered so base measures 1 3/4" x 8" long. Add a binder row to hold base in place. Upsett the base.

Sides: You will weave all start and stop rows using any variety size weavers you choose. As you go up the sides, you will shape your basket going straight up as shown in the picture. Weave to a height of 3 ½ or until your desired height. Pack weaving. Fold and tuck every out side spoke into your weaving cut off all inside spokes flush with the top. Insert your handle on the outside back the notch may or not catch into weaving if not then your rim will rest on it instead.

### Rim:

Rim using two pieces of ½" flat reed. Insert the sea grass as rim filler then lash with ¼" flat.

### **Gunter K. Anderson**

Cherokee Artist and Basket Weaver Gunter K. Anderson died at noon on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of January 2011. She was born Gunter Payne Kinsey October 16, 1920 at Kinsey, OK.

In 1997 at the age of 77, Gunter discovered her natural talent as a basket weaver. Since then she has produced many beautiful and intricate baskets. One of her baskets was honored with first place in the national Daughters of the American Revolution Arts and Crafts Contest. Mrs. Anderson was a current 50-Year Member of DAR, Oklahoma Native Basket Weavers Association and a charter member of the Cherokee Artist Association. She was a lifetime member of the VFW. She will be missed by many.

# **Beginner's Class**



# NAPKIN BASKET

### **Materials:**

5/8" FF-spokes ½" FF-weavers- inside and outside rim 3/16" –bottom retaining row and lasher Seagrass – rim filler

Base 7" X 7" square, 3" High

Using 5/8" FF, cut 14 spokes of natural reed at 18" each

Wet spokes and mark wrong, (rough) side of all 18" reed spokes

Layout 7 of the 18" spokes horizontally.

Weave in the center vertical spoke beginning under the first Horizontal spoke

Square up the base to 7" X 7"

Leave about 3/8" space between spokes.

Weave with 3/16" around the square bottom one time, flattening the corners at an angle.

Upset spokes gently.

### **Sides:**

Weave 6 start /stop rows of flat 1/2" reed. The 6<sup>th</sup> row of ½" will be the under the rim row.

Pack your weavers down, square the corners, and cut and tuck spokes.

Rim with ½" flat reed inside and outside of rim, with sea grass between the rims, and lash with 3/16" flat oval reed.
