

## WEAVING AT OU SCHOOL OF ARCHITECTURE

IN MARCH MARCIA, NANCY, AND MARY SPENT 6 AFTERNOONS TEACHING A LARGE GROUP OF UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA ARCHITECTURE STUDENTS TO WEAVE ROUND AND FLAT REED. THE FRESHMEN STUDENTS WERE TAKEN TO THE NATIONAL WEATHER CENTER IN NORMAN AND TAUGHT THE SCIENCE OF DIFFERENT KINDS OF STORMS. THE ASSIGNMENT WAS TO THEN PICK A STORM; I.E. TORNADO, HURRICANE, LIGHTNING, ETC. AND CREATE A PHYSICAL STRUCTURE USING REED AND THE WEAVING SKILLS THAT THEY LEARNED TO DEPICT THE SCIENCE OF THE STORM. DO YOU SEE SOME THAT ARE ACTUALLY EXAMPLES OF ART? THE STUDENTS WERE YOUNG, ENERGETIC, CURIOUS, FRIENDLY, AND SMART; SO, THEY WERE A PLEASURE TO TEACH. MAYBE SOME WILL SOMEDAY WANT TO WEAVE BASKETS LIKE WE DO. THE OTHER THING WE GOT OUT OF THE EXPERIENCE WAS--- THEIR GENERATION IS GOING TO DO GREAT THINGS. IT WAS ENCOURAGING!
















