May Guild Project – Woven Pendant



The project for May is a pendant woven with waxed linen on a small glass bottle. The bottle is 1 ½" tall. The finished pendant with fringe and top loop is about 4" depending on how long you want the fringe. A kit with bottle, waxed linen, Bali (bead top), and coordinating beads will be provided for a cost of \$10. Bali is glued in. Special glue will be provided. There will be a choice of colors and Bali tops. Please bring small embroidery scissors and a tape measure. A cloth or small bowl to set beads on would be helpful. Bring pointed tweezers if you have them but don't buy any as I will have extra. This fun simple project will take about 4 hours to complete. All the weaving is done with techniques used for round reed. Most chains will fit the hole in the Bali. Chains are not provided. The class is for the pendant only.
