The BWGOK met Saturday July 9, 2011 at the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum in OKC. President Onita Lynch called the meeting to order. Minutes from the last meeting were considered and approved – with one change that Janet Newman was the winner of the May raffle basket.

There were no visitors in attendance.

An independent audit has also been suggested. Plus, the mailbox will insure that all documents will be received.

Committee Reports:

<u>Project Committee</u>: For the September Guild meeting the *Positive Tomorrows* baskets will be wrapped for donation to *Positive Tomorrows*. We will also weave the *Indian Pottery Basket* using the 1990 pattern created by Billie Ruth Sudduth (brsbasket@aol.com).

For the November Guild meeting Janet Newman offered to provide a Christmas Bell pattern.

Newsletter: Rena Vickery had no report.

Nomination Committee: Jo Ann Miller reported that the BWGOK President and Treasurer offices would be up for election at the November Guild meeting. Need for a Treasurer was stressed as Joan Galbraith cannot retain that position next year.

Membership: Linda Tickle had no report.

Pattern Library: Marcia Balleweg - Books were here!

Bylaws Committee: Will meet at Oklahoma Basket Supply on August 13 to review the BWGOK By-Law. To be considered are: 1. Compliance officer for 501C status;

2. Vice-President duties: add/coordinate guild projects; 3. By-Laws will be posted on the BWGOK website.

Website Updates: Marcia Balleweg reported that all current newsletters are online and that the membership application has been updated and may be submitted with PayPal.

Quilt Show: If you did not receive Quilt Show announcements, please ask Onita Lynch for this information.

Discussion: Wire shelving is needed for display at the Quilt Show, September-fest, Weavers' Weekend, etc. This matter was tabled. Suggested were: (a) the guild could purchase shelving if a member is be willing to store and transport as needed, or (b) we pay Janet Newman or Pat Horsey rent to use their shelves.

September BWGOK Meeting Project: Indian Pottery Basket

In addition to the *Positive Tommorrows* baskets, those attending our upcoming BWGOK September meeting may make the *Indian Pottery Basket* pictured at right. The pattern, used with permission of (designer) Billie Ruth Sudduth, cannot be published here but will be available at the meeting for \$2.50. <u>As you can see, this is a great basket</u>!

Kits are available or you may bring your own materials. Jo Ann Miller has prepared two different kits: (1) kits including the pattern and all materials are available for \$15.00 or (2) kits including the pattern and all materials EXCEPT the 1/2" Flat Oval Reed are available for \$10.00. **PLEASE RSVP to Jo Ann Miller by Friday, September 2 if you want a kit** (phone: 405-863-8789 ; email: jam19482@aol.com).

Materials needed for this basket are:

- Twining: #3 Round Reed about 1/2 lb.
- 3/8" Flat Dyed Reed: 12 spokes @ 32" each.
- Rim: 1/2" Flat Oval Reed (optional may be rimless).

- Lashing: 1/4" Flat Oval Reed
- Loops/Braids: 1/2" Natural Reed. Cut 72-each only after basket is complete (about 20-yards of reed).
- Approximate Basket Dimensions: Base: 7.5"; Middle: 10"; Rim: 7-8".

While there they lodged with and worked with missionaries that are part of the Groundwork Guatemala organization (groundworkguatemala.org).

Guatemala has a wealth of natural basketry materials available, and Rena thought the native Guatemalans would like to learn basketry skill. To be associated with the mission, native Guatemalans typically make craft articles (wood, cloth weaving/sewing, etc) that are sold on the outside. F.Y.I. – New Book: Black Ash Baskets: Tips, Tools, & Techniques for Learning the Craft



CHECK IN: <u>Check-in will begin at 12:00PM on Friday</u> at the Canyon Camp Dining Hall. Classes will be conducted in the Tabernacle. Weavers will be given the opportunity to begin their weekend experience with Friday classes starting at 1:00PM. On Saturday and Sunday, the day will begin with breakfast served at 7:30AM with classes following. Classes will end by 12:00PM on Sunday.

ACTIVITIES: Vendors, Teachers' Market, Silent Auction, Raffle, and Scholarship are some of the activities planned for the weekend.

FOR MEMBER REVIEW: PROPOSED BWGOK BY-LAWS MODIFICATIONS

<u>ARTICLE I</u> — NAME: The name of the organization shall be BASKETWEAVERS GUILD OF OKLAHOMA, a non-profit organization.

- <u>ARTICLE II</u> PURPOSE: The object of BASKETWEAVERS GUILD OF OKLAHOMA is the preservation, promotion and education of the art of basketry.
- <u>ARTICLE III</u> MEMBERSHIP: Membership in BASKETWEAVERS GUILD OF OKLAHOMA shall be open to anyone interested in furthering the purpose of this organization, accompanied by the payment of annual dues.
- ARTICLE IV DUES
- Section 1: The annual dues will be \$15.00 due January 1, 2003 and of each year thereafter unless amended. Dues are non-refundable.
- Section 2: Members whose dues have not been received by February 1 the March meeting shall result in forfeiting membership and shall be dropped from the membership list.
- Section 3: Membership maybe reinstated upon payment of full amount of dues.
- ARTICLE V NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS
- Section 1: The elected officers of BASKETWEAVERS GUILD OF OKLAHOMA shall be President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer. The elected officers will serve a term of two years.
- Section 2: Elections shall be held in **November September** of odd years for President and Treasurer; **and** even years for Vice-President and Secretary.
- Section 3: The term of office shall begin upon the adjournment of the November meeting.
- Section 4: In the event any current elected officer is unable to complete their elected term, the President shall appoint another guild member to assume the duties of that office and complete that term.

ARTICLE VI — DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- Section 1: Duties of the President
 - a. Preside at all meetings.
 - b. Direct and coordinate the program and the activities of the guild meeting according to the by-laws.
 - c. Prepare and retain a written agenda for all meetings.
 - d. Create and dissolve committees as necessary.
- Section 2: Duties of the Vice-President
 - a. Work in close cooperation with the President.
 - **b.a.** Work in close cooperation with the President and pPerform such duties as may be assigned by the President.
 - b. Organize and schedule projects and program for guild meetings.
 - c. Preside in the absence of the President.
 - d. In the event the current President is unable to complete their elected term, the Vice-President shall assume that office and complete that term.
- Section 3: Duties of the Secretary
 - a. Record all minutes of the guild.
 - b. Be responsible for coordinating and distributing a membership roster.
 - **e.b.** Be custodian of all records and papers pertaining to the office and pass on those records and papers to the incoming Secretary.
 - c. Ensure 501c(3) taxes are completed and filed as required; maintain records of taxes filed

annually.

Section 4: Duties of the Treasurer

- a. Receive and deposit all revenues of the guild and pay **all** authorized bills, keeping an itemized account of **all** disbursements and receipts in depositories designated by the officers.
- b. Obtain the required signature cards and forms from the designated financial institutions for the officers qualified to sign.
- c. Present a written financial report at each regular meeting.
- d. Be custodian of all records and papers pertaining to the office and pass on all records and papers to the incoming Treasurer.

Section 5: Volunteer Positions

- a. Historian
- b. Librarian
- c. Newsletter Editor
- d. Membership Coordinator
- ARTICLE VII NEWSLETTER
- Section 1: A newsletter will be the primary means of communication among the members.
- Section 2: Newsletter Editor is a volunteer position.
- Section 3: Newsletter Editor will be responsible for compilation and distribution.
- Section 43: Secretary Membership Coordinator will provide a current mailing list to Newsletter Editor.

ARTICLE VIII - MEETINGS

- Section 1: The meetings of BASKETWEAVERS GUILD OF OKLAHOMA will be held the second Saturday of the following months: January, March, May, July, September, and November. The meeting will be held at the National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum in Oklahoma City or a site approved by guild officers.
- Section 2: Special meetings of the membership may be called by the President at a site designated by the President. Written notice, by newsletter or special mailing, must be given to all members in such an event.
- Section 3: A quorum shall be the members of the guild present and entitled to vote.

ARTICLE IX — DISSOLUTION

- Section 1: In the event of dissolution, the elected officers at the time of dissolution shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of debts, dispose of all remaining assets to a legally constituted, non-profit organization.
- Section 2: None of the property or any other asset of the guild nor any portion thereof shall be distributed to or for the use of any member of BASKETWEAVERS GUILD OF OKLAHOMA.

ARTICLE X — AMENDMENTS

- Section 1: The by-laws may be amended at any general membership meeting by a two-thirds vote of those present and voting providing the proposed amendment(s) has been submitted in writing and presented to the members one month prior to the vote.
- Section 2: By-laws will be reviewed yearly or as needed for the operation of the guild.
- ADOPTED: November 14, 1998
- AMENDED: November 13, 1999
- AMENDED: November 9, 2003
