Going not knowing

On the 12th October I announced my intention to step down as eldership team leader of Harvest Church.

When everything has been going so well in Harvest Church this may seem an unusual decision, so let me explain.

Why?

We believe that God can speak to us in all sorts of ways but primarily through the Bible and through people hearing what God may be saying through others, which always needs to be checked against the Bible and weighed by us and others who know us well. We want to be obedient to how God has directed our lives. This type of prophecy has shaped both my life and Emma's to the degree that we have changed jobs and locations as a result. Obedience flows from a heart surrendered to God, knowing the best place we can be is slap-bang in the

centre of his purposes for us as his loved children. God is trustworthy.

Some years ago, God had started to speak to Emma and me about how we were to be a part of Harvest Church for a season. This was all around laying/re-laying foundations in Harvest Church which would then be built on by a successor. As to when we had reached this point had been a topic of conversation for us as elders, together with those who oversee our church in Commission (www.commission.global), for quite some time. This shaped the appointment process we undertook which resulted in Tim & Helen Suffield moving to join us and for Tim work alongside me. We believe Tim is the person God has raised up to lead the team for the next season of Harvest Church and we rejoice in this.

What's happening now?

We have therefore started a team leader transition process which will culminate on Sunday 1st February 2026 when we will appoint Tim as the new eldership team leader. After which I will continue on team as one of the elders, to finish the transition, until Sunday 14th June 2026, when Emma and I will leave Harvest Church.

This is both an exciting but also challenging season, as Tim and I particularly, but also all the elders, staff team and church, adjust to me stepping back from things and Tim progressively taking more of the lead. We are intent on doing this really well, but please pray for everyone involved and indeed us as a church as we all adjust and when (if, is less likely) we get things wrong please extend grace wherever possible.



Change can be really hard to embrace and live through.

We want to encourage everyone, as we have learnt throughout this process, with these words:

Let's fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

TOP PRIORITY

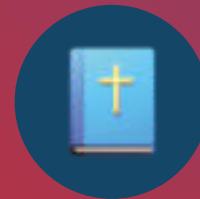

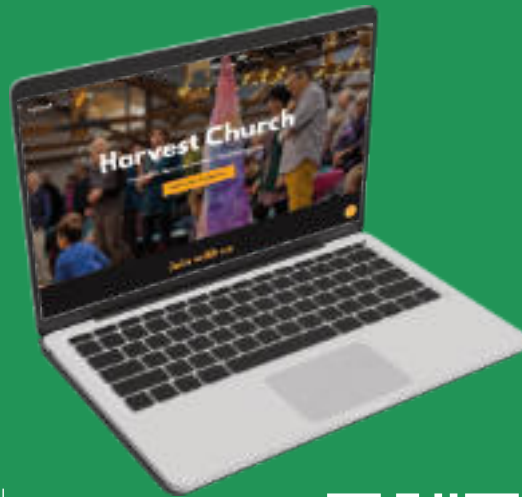

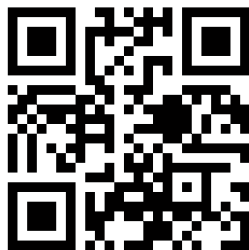

Meet Hannah

Hannah has joined us from Texas to spend a year serving as a Volunteer Intern with Harvest Church. She will be involved across several areas of church life, including our older youth, those in their twenties and members of our community over sixty. As she settles into life in Alton, she has shared a little of her story, her hopes for the year ahead and what has brought her to this point.

In 2019 the Lord planted a seed in my heart about potentially moving to the UK. At the time I honestly thought there was no way I would ever do that. Over the years, through a lot of prayer and learning to release my own plans to the Lord, that little seed grew. I came to the UK in January 2025 for six months with no plan at all, just faith that God would open a door if I was meant to stay. I joined a life group as soon as I arrived and started attending Harvest Church in June. Then the Lord opened the door in His perfect timing, and being part of this church has already been one of the biggest gifts in my life.

I am so excited to work with older youth. These years are so transformative and I cannot wait to walk alongside them, encourage them in who God has made them to be and watch how the Lord encounters them. I will also be spending time with people in their twenties. We are not



meant to do life alone, so I hope I can help create a space where people in that season can grow in their faith, build relationships and be in community with one another.

Another part of my role is connecting with people over sixty. I have learnt so much from older generations. They have encouraged me to live more fully, boldly, presently and joyfully. Friends in these age groups have reminded me many times that Jesus is the most important thing in life, especially when I have been caught up in the everyday hustle. I am genuinely humbled by my friends over sixty and I see them as such a gift.

There have been a few surprises since arriving in the UK, the biggest one being how early the sun sets in winter. I do miss home in small, but familiar, ways; especially Texas sunsets and some good Tex Mex. But I have already fallen in love with the

countryside here, and sheep always make my day. We do not really have sheep in Texas, so it still feels new and fun every time I see them.



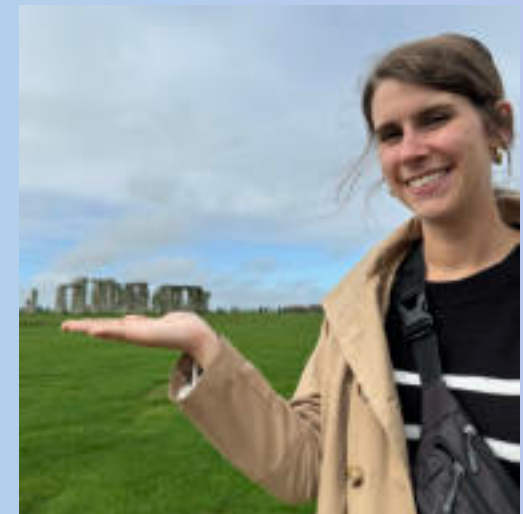
My relationship with God has been shaped most deeply by walking through years of unexplained health issues. Those seasons rebuilt my faith. The Lord has sustained me, grown me, refined me and shown me His love and faithfulness in ways I will never forget. I have learnt that true joy does not come from circumstances but from Jesus alone.

Outside of church and work, I love being in nature, experiencing new things and having a chat over tea. I also used to be an axe throwing coach at a previous job, which was



such a fun activity and something I still enjoy doing.

As I settle in, I hope people at Harvest will know how much I love intentional conversations about life and Jesus. If I could sum up what I hope this year will look like, it would be this. I want to gain deeper knowledge of the Bible and live out what I am learning, build relationships within the Alton community and bring the light of Jesus with me wherever I go and with whoever I meet.

With gatherings ranging from relaxed breakfasts to show visits and curry nights, the group has become a place where friendships form, stories are shared and people feel welcomed whether they own a classic car or not.

Where did your interest in classic cars begin?

I have always liked cars and spent over 30 years in the motor trade.

What kind of atmosphere do you aim to create at your gatherings?

A friendly and inclusive one. Anyone can come along. You do not need to own a classic car or classic motorbike.

What do your gatherings look like?

Very relaxed. We meet monthly, usually on the fourth Saturday of the month. Most often we meet at the Departure Lounge in Alton, although sometimes we head to places like Portsdown Hill, Avenue Nurseries or Goodwood. People receive regular update emails. Most meetups involve breakfast, plenty of chat and time spent around the cars.

What would you say to someone who is interested but nervous about turning up?

Get in touch with me and I will keep an eye out for them. Everyone is welcome.

You have also run curry nights and visited shows together. How do those different activities help build connection?

They give people more ways to spend time together. Cars are the common interest, but the different activities are what open the door to friendships.

What has surprised you most about leading the group?

The way it has grown and how many friendships have developed. Some members have even begun attending church through getting involved.



Is there a standout moment for you?

One of the highlights every year is the Alton Classic Car Show in the High Street. We try to arrive together and park alongside each other. It is a great day of admiring cars and chatting with the public.

What impact do you think the group has on people's sense of belonging?

It gives people a place to meet others with a shared interest and to feel part of something.

How do groups like this help church be more than just Sundays?

It is about doing life together. Helping each other, sharing experiences and bonding over something we enjoy.

What have you personally gained from being part of the group?

I have made new friends and it is helping me ease into retirement.

Finding Connection in a Remote World: How Alton Maltings Became Our Weekly Hub

Like many organisations, the pandemic reshaped how we work. With most of us working from home since March 2020 and the lease on our office being up for renewal in the July, we made the decision to permanently move to a working from home model.

While remote working has many benefits, we found ourselves missing connection, collaboration, and a change of scenery. Alton Maltings stood out for its warm atmosphere, central location, and flexibility. With several room sizes, good parking, and helpful staff, it is the perfect space for us to come together.

Initially we were meeting once every other week, but over time saw how much value it brought and so increased to meeting together every Thursday. Supported by a dedicated Wi-Fi connection and plenty of access to power sources, it is easy for



everyone to bring and set up their portable tech devices and be ready to work within minutes of arrival. Regular team meetings are conducted while we're all in person as well as casual discussions which often prove to be invaluable. We take the opportunity to have lunch out together, at one of the many local food establishments.

It is a relaxed, productive, and refreshing time, a highlight of the week for many. Having a regular in-person rhythm helps with morale and team cohesion. It is easier to solve problems face to face and hash out

complex solutions especially if they involve hardware, and being out of the house, even once a week, has been good for our mental wellbeing, whilst retaining a majority working from home structure which affords the team quiet, focussed time with all the added flexibility often lacking from a permanent full-time office (not to mention the cost savings!).

The Wi-Fi is reliable, the refreshments are good quality, and the rooms are bright and quiet.

We appreciate the flexibility to book just one day at a time. The whole building is well kept, with a buzz of activity, seeing various groups use the building is a refreshing change from a stuffy, office block.

If you are working remotely but miss being around people, consider booking a space at Alton Maltings. Whether it is for team catch-ups or solo working in a new environment, it might be just the break in routine that your week needs.

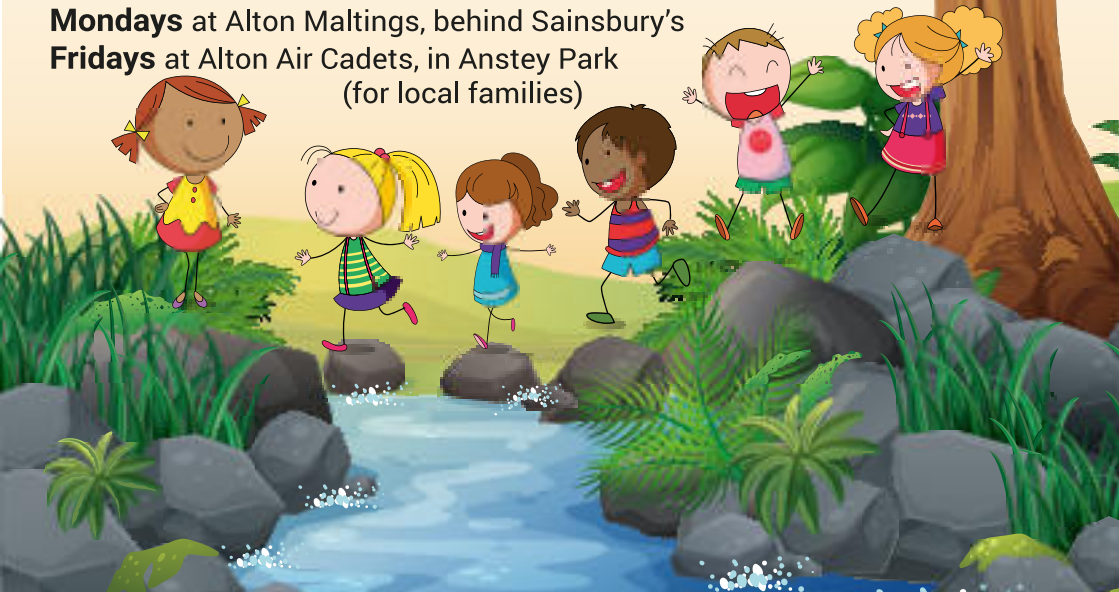
