In June 2014 Harvest Church partnered with CAP to start the free Debt Help Service in Alton and the surrounding area. People with unmanageable debt contact us, we visit clients in their homes to provide a personal debt help service, and offer to pray with them.







Our first Debt Centre Manager, Mark Rumsby, was succeeded by Steve Hannington in 2022. Today we have a team of 20-30 volunteers.



In the last 10 years, the Alton Debt Centre has received 275 enquiries, and has significantly helped over half of them, enabling 99 households (600 adults and children) to become debt-free and transforming their lives!

# 75th Birthday Celebration

In 1949 a small group of Christians started to meet together to encourage each other in their faith. In due course they decided to form into a church, as a community of believers gathered to Jesus.

Alton Evangelical, and then Alton
Evangelical Free Church (AEFC),
gradually grew. Initially meeting
in a home in Lenten Street; we
moved to premises on Amery
Hill, then to the Forresters Hall
on Church Street. In 2005, we
renamed to Harvest Church and
moved to Alton Maltings, a centre
for the church and wider community.





In this time the church has pioneered new social intiatives including a Toy Library, toddler groups (Stepping Stones), groups for adults needing support (OneWay, Fresh Start and Lighthouse) and, more recently, CAP services including Debt Help, Job Club and Money Coaching.

We have also helped to support other community initiatives such as **Food Bank** and **ADCRF** (see page 14).



Throughout the last 75 years we have not lost our purpose - to be a welcoming, inclusive community helping people to know Jesus and love Him.



# Alton and District Community Relief Foundation

The Alton & District
Community Resilience Fund
was established during the
Covid pandemic to support
people in the Alton area
experiencing financial
hardship.

Re-branded in 2023, the Alton & District Community Relief Foundation (ADCRF) has been taken forward by partnership representation from Harvest Church, Alton Lions Club (CIO), Parish of the Resurrection and Citizens Advice. It has continued to support local individuals and families and is now a registered charity.

The five Trustees receive applications on a referral basis, and award one-time grants of up to £600. With funds going directly to the provider of the goods or service required.

The Trustees also signpost applicants to services and resources, such as Citizens Advice Bureau, Alton Food Bank, Community Cupboard, Resurrection Furniture, Christians Against Poverty (CAP), and youth and family support charities and organisations.

"Where possible, we collaborate with local charities, service organisations and funding sources to avoid duplication and to promote a joined-up response, in a bid to maximise impact and good practice, to support those in need."

Funding for the ADCRF currently comes from Harvest Church, Alton Lions, and from Hampshire County Council's Connect4Communities Fund.

# Alton Arts Festival tickets on sale now

Alton Maltings provides a key venue for the inaugural Alton Arts Festival, a not-for-profit celebration of the arts, creativity and community.

ickets are on sale now for the Alton Arts Festival. Arts lovers will be able to purchase tickets for a range of comedy and music gigs, art workshops, literary discussions, and theatre shows.

"We're so proud to get the majority of this amazing programme on sale," says Chair Annie Lancaster. "It has been a Herculean effort by our programme leads to bring this eclectic range of events to the festival. Having seen how quickly tickets were snapped up for the first wave, we're urging people to act fast – some of our venues are very intimate and the workshops in particular are designed for small groups, so will sell out quickly."

The stone-sculpting workshop with David Wilkins sold out within the first week of going on sale last month, and AAF has issued low-ticket warnings on a number of music events.

"But fear not – this second wave is much bigger than the first, so we hope there's something to catch everyone's interest," adds Annie.

Events going on sale today include

Carmody, recently crowned "South

London's electronic soul queen" and known
for her hit 'Paradise', which featured in
the hit Netflix series Heartstopper. Also
in the music programme is a special
performance by Grammy-award nominated
Richard Walters – his only solo show for
2024 – which will feature songs written
specially for and about Alton. Richard will be
joined by renowned author and illustrator,
and former Waterstones children's
laureate, Chris Riddell, who will be liveillustrating Richard's music in a unique and
collaborative performance.

From the literature programme, highlights include the 'Writers on Writers' panel, where crime authors BA Paris, Sophie Hannah and Simon Toyne will discuss what it takes to plot multiple murders, and the historical fiction panel, during which four authors will share their thoughts on the importance of place in historical novels in the evocative setting of St Nicholas' Church, Chawton.

For those keen to explore new skills in visual arts, there are more workshops coming your way, including life drawing, the use of pastels, watercolour painting, how to draw a bird with artist Paul Harfleet, how to make a contemporary textile wall hanging with Hilary Kimber, and an artistic exploration of nature with Tozzy Bridger.

"This is just a handful of the events that are going on sale. There's also comedy, theatre, classical music, and so much more. Alton will be overflowing with creativity," says Annie.

"Alton Arts Festival is designed to be selffunding and not-for-profit, with all events priced to cover their own costs," says Annie. "However, we are also putting on an ambitious outreach programme, which will go into about 14 primary schools during the week of the festival. This will benefit around 2800 local children in the Alton cluster - ensuring that even those children who wouldn't normally be able to attend events like these with their families get the opportunity to experience the arts. We have made great headway raising money to cover the cost of this programme so that it is entirely free to schools, but there's still some way to go.
