



"The main surprise to me was finding faith!"

Laura attended the Alpha Course in the first half of 2024. In this candid interview with Marie Hall, Laura shares her transformative journey, from skepticism to finding faith, and offers her insights on the experience.

Laura, thank you for joining us today. Let's start at the beginning. Why did you decide to attend the Alpha Course?

"When I was invited to join Alpha, I thought it would be perfect to prove everyone there wrong. I came expecting to be able to disprove the existence of God and that the beliefs were all wrong."

That's quite an intriguing motive! Before Alpha, what were your beliefs about faith?

"The question of faith before I became a Christian is tricky. I was very open to eastern religions such as Hinduism where they have many gods, but Christianity with one God I couldn't comprehend. I could best be described as agnostic, and just thought Christianity was a cult."

It sounds like you were quite skeptical. Did anything about the course surprise you?

"The main surprise to me was finding faith and also that Christians are normal people from all walks of life."

That's wonderful to hear. Would you recommend the Alpha Course to others?

"Yes, I would 100% recommend the Alpha Course to everyone! The source material answered so many questions. The hosts are so knowledgeable and friendly. If you know someone who is perhaps interested in finding God, please bring them to the next one."

It seems your perspective has shifted quite a bit. How has your opinion changed since attending Alpha?

"Initially, I went into the first session all guns blazing, ready to disprove everything. But over time, I met real Christians, found faith, received the Holy Spirit, and became part of a larger family than I could have ever imagined. This has completely transformed my view."

That's a significant transformation. What would you say is the best thing about the Alpha Course?

"I don't think there is one singular thing that can be described as the 'best'. I have made wonderful friends since and during the Alpha experience. You will never be judged for asking questions, however 'stupid' they may seem, and the food is very good too!"


At Alton Maltings, our committed team is ready to assist you in making sure your booking and event are a success.

Who are we?

Youth Life Group, or YLG for short, is a group for youth in school years 10 to 13. From September our regular weekly meetings will be on a Tuesday evening at **Alton Maltings**.

Our sessions during term time have the following structure:

We start promptly at **7:15 PM** where we have discussions and Bible studies and explore a wide range of topics.

Then between **8:15PM** and **9:15PM** we have a social time where we engage in an array of activities, catering to diverse interests.

These include group activities, board games, consoles, quizzes, and much more; ensuring an engaging and enjoyable time for all. We also run a number of additional activities with at least one offsite activity a term.




HINGS HINGS RAS

The King's Arms Youth Project

(KA) is set to celebrate its 25th anniversary, marking a significant milestone in its ongoing mission to support young people in the Alton and Petersfield areas. Located at the bottom of Vicarage Hill in Alton, KA opens its doors daily during term time, offering a welcoming space for young people after school where they can engage in games, crafts, and receive essential support from dedicated youth

workers.





KA's primary goal is to create a fun and secure environment that young people can truly consider their own. However, its impact extends far beyond after-school activities. KA collaborates with local schools to deliver both group and individual mentoring programnes, supports young people with additional needs, and offers specialised programmes for young carers.

Established in Petersfield by a group of local churches, KA's origins are deeply rooted in its community-driven mission. This heritage remains integral to KA's vision and values, as evidenced by its Faith programme, which supports local churches in their youth work and encourages young people to explore faith in an engaging and accessible manner.

As KA celebrates **25 years** of service, its commitment to providing a supportive, inclusive, and dynamic environment for young people remains steadfast, continuing to make a significant difference in the lives of the youth it serves.



OUR STORY



We are Soji and Sonia Odukomaiya.

We moved to Alton two years ago from Nigeria with our three children. Life was tough at first. Sonia had a job, but we had nowhere to live. The property we thought we had secured was withdrawn and agencies would not rent to us because we did not earn enough.

We spent months in one room at a hotel in Four Marks, which depleted our savings and made it difficult for Sonia to get to work in Alton. I (Soji) was unable to work as most jobs needed a DBS check, which I could not get without an address. This also prevented the children from starting school.

We were desperate but trusted God.
As Christians we looked for a church
and found Harvest Church. The church
was loving and welcoming. Our new
friends found us a property from a
private landlord and completely
furnished the house to turn it into a
home.

We had previously visited the local school but they did not have spaces for our school aged children. But a friend took Sonia back before we moved. She met the Headteacher and was told they could now take both children. We were amazed.

We were also helped with job applications and soon I found a job I enjoy.

Life here is very different from Nigeria but our friends at Harvest Church have helped us adjust.

We thank God for leading us here and giving us such a great church family.

Basingstoke & Alton Cardiac Rehabilitation Charity Ltd

On 23rd November 2023, Sir Paul Nurse, Nobel Laureate and Director of the Francis Crick Institute, delivered the Cardiac Rehab Autumn Lecture at Alton Maltings. Over 300 attendees were captivated by his talk, "What is Life."

Sir Paul, known for his work on cell division, explored five ideas he believes define life: the cell as life's fundamental unit, DNA and genes shaping organisms, Darwin's evolution by natural selection, life as a series of chemical reactions, and life as information. He shared his fascination with insects, adding depth to the lecture.

A Q&A followed, addressing cell division and T cell responses. Dr. Andrew Bishop, consultant cardiologist, thanked Sir Paul for his contributions to science and for inspiring hope in life's resilience. He compared evolution's adaptability to the Cardiac Rehab Centre's 30-year evolution in addressing heart disease and now cancer rehabilitation.

The event raised funds for the Basingstoke and Alton Cardiac Rehabilitation Charity. CEO Sarah Quarterman thanked Sir Paul and the event sponsors, Sheen Stickland, emphasising the charity's reliance on such events for funding their heart and cancer rehabilitation work.

The evening featured a reception with wine, soft drinks, and homemade canapés, and Sir Paul signed copies of his book, "What is Life." The event raised £8,900, supporting the charity's mission.

It features Kay Linnell, former Treasurer and Vice-Chair of the Expert Witness Institute, a forensic accountant who worked on the Post Office's Horizon system scandal. 

NEW Websites


In June this year we updated our Alton Maltings and the Harvest Church websites to better serve our community, visitors and clients.

Social Prescribing: Your Bridge to Better Wellbeing

In 2019, the A31 Primary Care Network decided to employ a social prescriber to work within the local area. Here Sylwia Tickle explains more out more about their role.

At The Wilson Practice, Chawton Park Surgery, and Boundaries Surgery, a dedicated team of social prescribers—Sylwia, Emilia, Chrissy, and Sarah—work tirelessly to enhance community wellbeing. Their efforts are aimed at supporting patients with a variety of needs, providing a crucial complement to the medical care offered by these practices.

Mission and Approach

The role of social prescribers is to address the non-medical factors that impact health, such as mental health challenges, housing issues, financial difficulties, and social isolation. By bridging the gap between medical services and community resources, they offer personalized support to each individual, tailored to their unique circumstances.



Areas of Support

Social prescribers provide a wide range of services, including:

- Care Needs: Arranging in-home support, connecting with carers, and finding respite care options.
- Mental Health: Linking patients with mental health services, support groups, and counselling.
- Housing: Collaborating with local agencies to secure safe accommodation and resolve landlord disputes.
- Finances: Guiding patients on managing finances, accessing benefits, and finding financial support.
- Physical Activities: Connecting patients with local exercise programs, walking groups, and sports clubs.
- Social Isolation: Organising community activities and social groups to combat loneliness.

Community Engagement

Throughout the year, the team hosts events focused on health and wellbeing, tailored to address the specific health concerns within the Alton community. These events, which include mental health workshops and fitness sessions, provide opportunities for community members to meet experts and gain valuable insights. Reaching Out

The social prescribers are committed to ensuring that no one in the community feels alone or unsupported. Whether you have a minor concern or a significant issue, they are available to listen and guide you toward the appropriate support. Their work is driven by a desire to make a positive difference in patients' lives, ensuring access to the support needed for a healthy, fulfilling life.


