Alton Foodbank

Alton foodbank* is a project founded initially by The Butts Church, and run by local churches, working together towards stopping hunger in Alton and surrounding villages.



Alton Foodbank (located in the Market Square)

Food and financial gifts are donated by churches, individuals, companies, community groups or charities and by the public through collection points in the major supermarkets in our local area and at Alton Maltings. We are regularly supported by SKU Logistics, who help transport the food from our warehouse to the centre for our three weekly sessions.



The foodbank works with a range of local agencies, who meet people at risk of going hungry, and are able to provide the most appropriate help for their circumstances. If necessary, they will issue a foodbank e-voucher and provide long term support to help address some of the issues behind the reasons for the crisis. Agencies we work with include: Citizens Advice, housing support officers, children's centres, health visitors, social services, social prescribers and some local charities.



Sian (Project Manager) & Rick (Managing director of SKU)

We have a team of wonderful volunteers, along with two paid members of staff, Sian & Marie, who enable the Foodbank to work in a friendly and supportive way. We have about 55 volunteers from all walks of life, who work in the warehouse, centre or a combination of both.

I believe the Encounter Room provides a way for everyone, and anyone, to meet with God. For me it creates a special environment in which I find it easy to sit thoughtfully for a while and then, perhaps, chat over the week's events with Him, discuss my hopes and plans, or even pour out my confusion or fear. Wandering around the different 'stations' I choose one or two things that help me to rest, think and pray. One time it was a towel, placed with a bowl, helping me to picture Jesus washing my feet, with love in His eyes.



Another time I picked up a picture showing a woman laughing unreservedly; I thought and talked with Him about what might keep me from laughing with such deep delight. There's always a chance to draw or write your prayers, information to help you pray for other people and other countries, poems, pictures and more. I like to be on my own, others like to go with someone else, and you can visit for as long, or as short, as you like.

Quiet Days at Newlands Farm



A Quiet Day is a chance to reconnect with God and hear from Him, with optional guidance. They typically run on Saturdays from 10am to 4pm.

The day begins with a hot drink and a short introduction. A theme and suggestions are provided to guide your individual reflection and connection with God. After a break for lunch, there's another quiet session with various resources available. These include books and crafts, or you can enjoy walking in the countryside. The day concludes with optional sharing and a final prayer.

Here's what others have said about their experience:

Rosie:

"I have been attending the Quiet Days for several years since they started. They are a great opportunity to take time out of a busy life. There is definitely no reason to find them intimidating in any way. You don't need to feel especially spiritual but to see the day as an opportunity to be cocooned in warmth and love. It is amazing how you can feel so at one with the whole group even though you don't speak, except during the wonderful lunch provided by the owner of the house. There is always a real sense of peace. It is a time to relax and listen to what is going on in your heart and mind and know that the Father always welcomes you unconditionally."

Steve:

"I get along to almost all the Quiet Days. I find the time spent out of the normal run of things to be really helpful. In theory, as I am retired, I should be able to make quiet spaces at home but that doesn't work for me – there are always things that interrupt."

I find that I can focus more effectively at the Quiet Day. One recent Day, I read an epistle as a whole, ignoring the chapter and verse divisions, to see it as a letter, as it would have been received at the time. Another time, I did some reading around a specific topic we were looking at in Church. I almost always set myself some sort of aim or target but I do not let that become a pressure."

There are other things to do—go for a walk, look at the Odiham airfield landing lights, put logs on the fire and suchlike. We have a break for lunch too. Ruth and Debbie will provide material to use as a basis for meditation and will offer some suggestions for what you might do—but there is no compulsion to do that."

I find them to be both relaxing and helpful, giving me space to try to focus on God."
