Prof Elizabeth Phillips MD FIDSA FAAAAI @vumc_cdsi_rsch Infectious Diseases Physician and Clinical Pharmacologist (USA)

World leader in translational drug hypersensitivity who has pioneered the discover and implementation of immunogenomic predictors, immunopathogenesis and novel technologies into clinical practice. She has led clinical and research programs in drug hypersensitivity across different medical systems for over 25 years.



Dr Kimberly Blumenthal MD MSc @KimberlyBlumen1 *Allergist/Immunologist (USA)*

Is a drug allergy researcher at Massachusetts General Hospital and Assistant Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School. She is the Co-Director of the Clinical Epidemiology Program within the Division of Rheumatology Allergy and Immunology and the Quality and Safety Officer for Allergy at the Edward P. Lawrence Center for Quality and Safety. Dr Blumenthal performs drug allergy research that uses methods of epidemiology, informatics, economics, and decision science. Dr Blumenthal is recognized nationally for identifying the morbidity and mortality associated with unverified penicillin allergy and creating innovative approaches to the evaluation of antibiotic allergies.



A/Prof Jonny Peter MB ChB MMed FCP (SA) PhD @JonnyPeter7 *Allergist/Immunologist (South Africa)*

A specialist in internal medicine at the Groote Schuur Hospital, University of Cape Town and the Allergy and Immunology unit, UCT Lung Institute. Current clinical and research interests include: i) immune-mediated adverse drug reactions ii) urticaria and angioedema, as well as the intersection between COVID-19 and immunogenomic pathways associated with Angioedema iii) primary immunodeficiencies, and iv) the aerobiology of South Africa. His research work is supported by grant funding from the NIH, EDCTP, SA NRF & MRC.



A/Prof Lene Garvey MD, PhD @lenehgarvey *Anaesthetist (Denmark)*

A specialist in Anaesthesiology with subspecialisation in Allergology. She is co-founder and Head of the Danish Anaesthesia Allergy Centre, the Danish National Reference Centre for investigation of perioperative hypersensitivity. She is an Associate Professor at the University of Copenhagen and a consultant in the Allergy Clinic, Gentofte Hospital, Denmark. She is vice chair of the Danish Society of Allergology, Secretary of the EAACI Drug Allergy Interest Group, an active member of several EAACI task forces and co-chair of the EAACI Drug Hypersensitivity Meeting in Verona 2023. She is a founder member of the ISPAR (International Suspected Perioperative Allergic Reactions) Group. Research interests include perioperative hypersensitivity, penicillin allergy de-labelling and allergy to chlorhexidine, PEG and other rare allergens.



Prof Michael Arden-Jones BSc, MBBS, DPhil, FRCP *Dermatologist (United Kingdom)*

Michael Ardern-Jones trained in Dermatology at St John's Institute of Dermatology, London and subsequently Oxford. He was appointed to University Hospitals Southampton NHS Trust and to the Faculty of Medicine, University of Southampton in 2007. He has a specific academic interest in inflammatory skin disease, skin allergy and drug hypersensitivity reactions. His clinical unit undertakes clinical trials in atopic eczema and other skin diseases. MAJ has long-standing research interest in all aspects of atopic eczema and severe cutaneous adverse reactions (SCAR) including immunological mechanisms, immunotherapy, and the skin microbiome.
