The Stage is Set

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Elko, Nevada Gold Mines, the City of Elko, and a group of local citizens, representing a group of public and private entities, have come together and created a comprehensive plan to build a new recreation and aquatics center in Elko County. The need for a new recreation and aquatics center was identified over 15 years ago. The new recreation center will be owned and operated by the Boys & Girls Club. Over the past 15 years, the pools have deteriorated and are operating on borrowed time. The new recreation center is projected to break ground in April 2024, with a grand opening in June 2025. The stage is set and a capital campaign is underway to secure the funds to make this vision become a reality.

GOVERNANCE

The Boys & Girls Club is a 501 C(3) non-profit organization and is governed by a 15-member Board of Directors that represents our community. The CEO of the Boys & Girls Club works for the Board of Directors and is responsible for fulfilling the Board of Directors strategic initiatives and policies.

An Oversight Committee consisting of two County Commissioners, County Manager, two City of Elko Council members, City of Elko Administrator, two Boys & Girls Club representatives, Nevada Gold Mines Representative, Silver State Stampede Representative, and Elko County Fair Board Representative will be put in place to help oversee the new center. Open Meeting Law will be utilized to manage this committee. It is important to understand that no Board of Director member or Oversight Committee member receives any compensation for this project.

LOCATION

The Boys & Girls Club will utilize the current swimming pool location for the new recreation center. This is the perfect location to utilize the geothermal line and serve the community. It is also important to understand that although the land was donated to the Boys & Girls Club, it must be used for the charitable purpose outlined. The land would revert back to the City of Elko if this purpose were to cease.

PHASES

This project is broken into two phases with the Recreation Center & Aquatics Center as phase I and the outdoor swimming pool in phase II. It is the goal to secure the funding to build the entire Recreation Center and Aquatic Centers in the initial phase.

CURRENT SWIMMING POOLS

The goal is to keep the current indoor swimming pool building for future community programs.

BASQUE HOUSE/HEAD START

The Basque House and the Head Start childcare center will not be affected in any way by this project.

GEOHERMAL LINE

A coalition is in place with a goal of securing resources to fix the current geothermal line. Fixing the current geothermal line would benefit the Elko County School District and the new Recreation Center.

A Mission of Service

SERVING THE YOUTH AND FAMILIES IN ELKO COUNTY

The new recreation center will significantly increase the Boys & Girls Clubs capacity to serve more children and families in Elko County.

MEETING COMMUNITY GOALS

The citizens of Elko County have identified, over 15 years ago, the need and dream for a recreation center. The Boys & Girls Club can make Elko County's dreams become a reality.

MAKING AN ECONOMIC IMPACT

The new recreation center will give Elko County the ability to bring in national, state, and regional aquatic events, which would dramatically affect our businesses, citizens, and tax base. This new facility would also help our local businesses attract the workforce necessary for success. Simply put, this new recreation center will make Elko a destination, and this project will be an economic game changer.

MEETING OUR AQUATIC NEEDS

The current pools are outdated and deteriorating. This new recreation center would offer state-of-the-art pools to meet our community's needs for generations to come. The current outdoor pool has deteriorated and have been officially closed. Needless to say, the current pools are operating on borrowed time.

IMPROVING QUALITY OF LIFE

A recreation center of this magnitude would give our citizens high level recreation opportunities, sporting activities, youth development services, aquatic programming, and additional events.

SERVING EXISTING EVENTS AND ORGANIZATIONS

A recreation and events complex of this magnitude would benefit several of our existing organizations.

City of Elko: This proposed project would not only serve the residents of Elko but would also increase the city's tax base, eliminate city's aquatic oversight, decrease city's expenses, and reduce maintenance workloads.

Elko County: This project would not only serve Elko residents but would affect the entire county.

Anaconda Swim Team: This new facility would give our youth swim team the facilities necessary to compete and host local meets and events.

SERVING TEENS

The new Recreation Center will include a comprehensive Teen Center. This new center paired with the aquatic centers, gymnasium, and fitness makes this the perfect place for our youth.

ADDRESSING THE OBESITY EPIDEMIC

Nationwide, approximately 17% of individuals have currently been identified as obese. Being overweight puts children and teenagers at greater risk for developing type II diabetes, and other health conditions including asthma, sleep apnea, and psychosocial effects such as decreased self-esteem. The new Recreation Center will host a state-of-the-art health and wellness center and programs to give our citizens the opportunities necessary to live a healthy lifestyle. The center will consist of group exercise space, cardiovascular equipment, weight training equipment, and wellness facilities. A healthy community is a thriving community.

INDOOR COMPETITIVE SWIMMING POOL

The Aquatics Center at the new Recreation Center will have an indoor six-lane competitive swimming pool with diving well and seating. This is the perfect pool for swim team, lap swim, and open swim.



INDOOR WARM-WATER SWIMMING POOL

The Aquatics Center at the new Recreation Center will also have an indoor four-lane warm-water pool with water slide, children's play area, and kiddie pool. This is the perfect pool for youth swim lessons, swim team warm-up/cool-down lanes, water fitness, open swim, and water therapy.



OUTDOOR SWIMMING POOL

The Recreation Center will have an outdoor swimming pool with water slides and concession area making this the perfect place for summer fun.

KITCHEN

The new Recreation Center will have a full service commercial kitchen capable of servicing major events. The kitchen will have service windows into the gym and outdoor swimming pool giving this kitchen the ability to serve major events while also doubling as concessions for aquatics, events, and sports.



TEEN CENTER

Investing in our teens is an investment into our future. The Recreation Center will have a teen center to give our young adults the proper place to develop. The new Teen Center will offer a computer lab, game room area, TV area, fitness space, and education space. The Teen Center mixed with the aquatics, fitness and gymnasium would give our teens the amenities that they deserve.

GAME ROOM

The center comes complete with game room, seating, and swimming pool viewing area.



WELLNESS CENTER

The recreation center will have a wellness room with state-of-the-art cardiovascular and weight equipment making this a great space for generations to come.

GYMNASIUM

The high school regulation gymnasium will be perfect for sports, special events, and community fundraisers. The gym will be equipped with 6 baskets to allow for full court and side court game use.



CONCESSION DECK

A state-of-the-art concession area with outdoor seating will be available to serve the aquatic centers and all of the indoor sporting events and leagues.

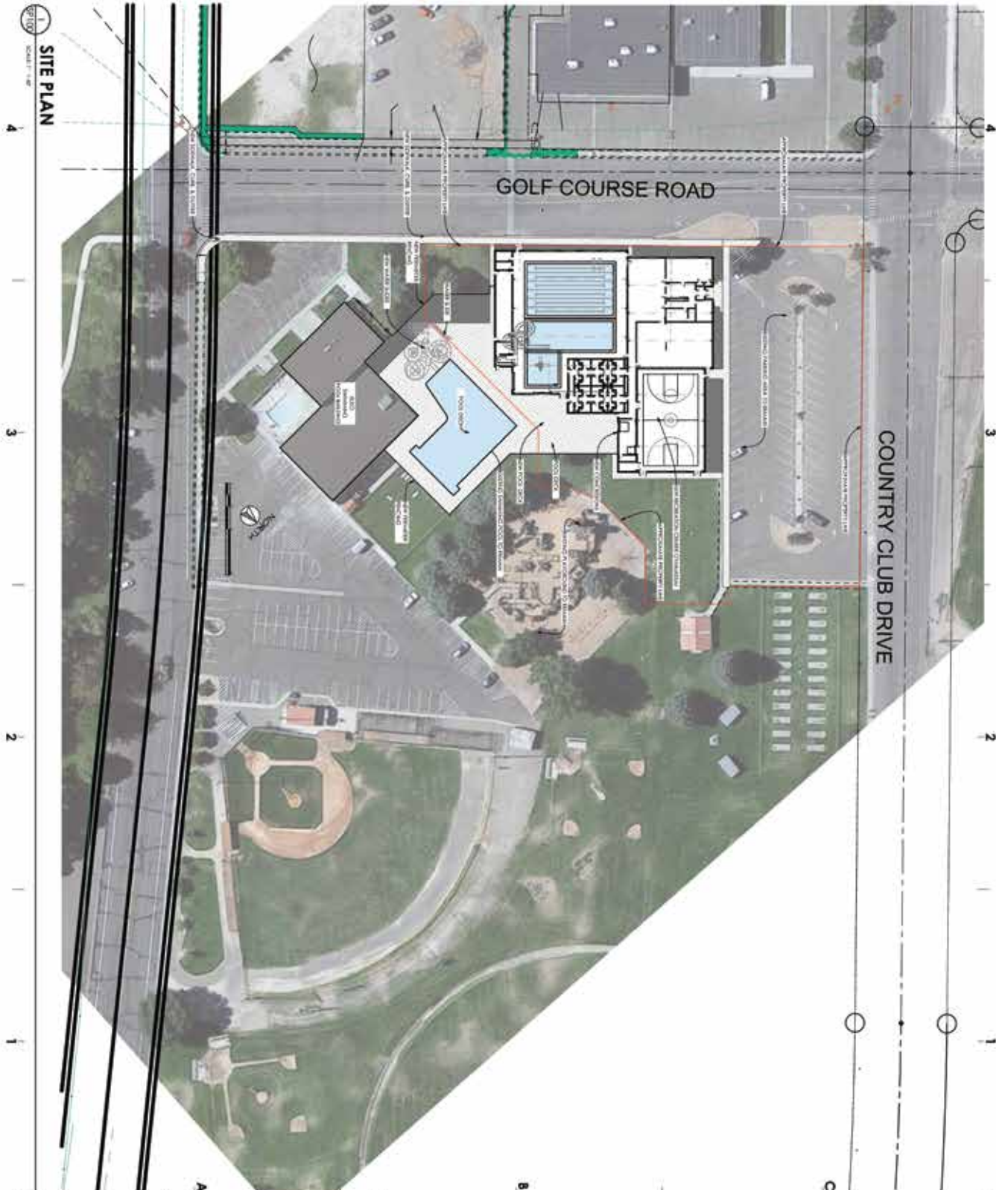


FAMILY STYLE BATHROOMS
