## — 2015 Kékfrankos —

**Kékfrankos** | Hungary's most widely planted red grape is the same variety as Austria's Blaufränkisch. In Hungary the grape displays red fruit, especially a sour cherry, but sometimes it can express more black fruit than red.

**Average Age of Vines** | 10-15 Years

**Vineyards** | Alsónána & Szentgál

**Soil** | loess

**Vinification** | Grapes were handpicked and fermented in open top fermenters and allowed to macerate for 7 days. The wine was then aged for 15 months in 10% used Hungarian oak 225L barrels and 90% used 500L Hungarian oak barrels.

**Tasting Notes** | It is a well-balanced wine with lingering flavors of red berries and spices. Thanks to the cooler plateau of Alsónána vineyard, this wine is built on its elegant acidity. It is a great expression of the feminine side of the variety.



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
