

BEACHES and BOATING

Dredging to Begin at Sailors Haven and Watch Hill on Fire Island

In the aftermath of Hurricane Sandy and multiple storm events in 2012 sediment accumulated in the Sailors Haven and Watch Hill navigation channels and marinas. In 2013 an environmental assessment to dredge this material and restore navigation channels to a width of 100 feet and depth of six feet at mean low tide was completed.


Earlier in 2014, a \$2.9 million contract was awarded to H&L Contracting of Bay Shore, New York, The project is funded through Hurricane Sandy disaster relief

"We are happy this work is underway," said Fire Island National Seashore Superintendent Chris Soller, "and to be able to continue to provide safe access to these facilities."

At Sailors Haven approximately 2,370 cubic yards of sediment from the dredged channel will be placed on the bay beach to the east and west of the marina. This material will help protect the Sunken Forest from accelerated rates of erosion. More than 49,000 cubic yards of sediment dredged from the Watch Hill channel will be deposited along the ocean front on the east end of Davis Park. The project is slated for completion by January 15, 2015.

Credit record freezes will be extended to protect minors starting Jan. 1. The law now lets parents or guardians place a freeze on the credit record of a child under the age of 16 to prevent their child from becoming a victim of identity theft.

February Town Meeting Highlights

COPE -Officers John Wright and Pete Rivera from 3rd Pct (community relations) addressed the community: Neighborhood Watch

Ashley and Eric will take the lead to set up Neighborhood Watch in GR; COPE will work with them

Later in the meeting, Ashley advised that they were still researching the program before rolling it out, and passed around a sign -up sheet for people if interested in participating. Officer Wright explained that not all streets need to participate, but that 50% of the houses on a block must participate and each block must have a block captain.

If you see something, say something – too often after an incident occurs, a neighbor will say they thought something wasn't right, but they never called the police.

Nixle is a free community notification system that allows SCPD to communicate with the public via text, email, twitter and Facebook. The messages range from emergency alerts to routine day to day information. Register via www.suffolkpd.org and click on the NIXLE icon at the top of the page.

COUNCILMANS FLOTTERON & COCHRANE

Councilmans Flotteron and Cochrane addressed the community: Angie Carpenter will take on the role of Town Supervisor the first week of March; she will have to run for office in November. Cochrane is Director of Veterans Affairs; the community passed veterans tax exemptions, but you have to call to sign up.

Snow removal. After 1" of snow, town code requires all cars are removed from the streets. If an area is badly hit and people can't park in their driveways or on the lawn because of too much snow accumulation, OEM would direct communities where to park. Donna recommended the town add the removal of basketball hoops from the street as well since the plows have to go around them too. The Councilmen recommended taking pictures of these areas and sending to the town.

PSEG COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

PSEG will never call / come to your house to ask you for your social security number and demand payment. If anything, they will tell you to call their office. **Phantom Power** – people don't realize the electricity being wasted with things like cable boxes and TVs plugged in, other plugs with transformers, extra unused refrigerators / freezers, snowbirds leaving items plugged in. Caring program - if you have medical issues that require electricity, sign up for the program to be a higher priority for restoration (requires a doctors note). **REAP program** – if you are having trouble paying your bills

The new department officers assumed their role on January 1st, 2015 and will be officially installed on February 28th, 2015. The Chief's Office is excited for the new year and hope to continue Great River Fire Department's tradition of dedication to the community and our neighboring departments.

Storm Preparation

The Great River Fire Department stands ready to protect the community from emergencies at all times. Severe weather doesn't change its state of readiness.

Winter Storm Juno was described by the national media as "historic," "record setting," and "crippling." As such, the department started its preparation days ahead of the storm.

Over and above normal monthly, weekly and daily inspections, all apparatus was readied. Starting with topping off fuel and fluids, the apparatus was inspected from top to bottom. Additional equipment was deployed on the apparatus: shovels to clear paths to fire hydrants or to gain access to resident's driveways and doors, and chain saws to clear downed trees caused by the 50MPH winds. Spare fuel for tools was double checked to ensure there was enough on hand to last the duration of the storm.

A standby was called beginning 8:00 pm the evening of the storm. A standby officially activates the department and holds manpower in quarters to allow for an instantaneous response in the event of an emergency activation.

The standby provided to be a great time for the manpower to focus on making improvements to the apparatus and the department. This came in the form of cleaning tools and equipment, starting saws and generators and checking individual's gear.

It's not all work during the standby. If you ask any firefighter to describe the fire service in one word, chances are they'd say "brotherhood." The 12 hour shift was a time to for the members to bond. From cooking dinner to watching a movie - all while keeping one ear on the fire radio - the members were reminded that the job is done for the community and for each other.

Did you clear your hydrant?

Help us help you! If you have a fire hydrant on your property, please clear the snow around it so that our response isn't delayed during an emergency. The house you save may be your own!
