ATTENTION RESIDENTS:

Suffolk County is entering into an agreement with St. John the Baptist and St. Anthony's high schools to launch their crew boats for practice purposes only from an area just inside Timber Point Country Club near Kayak Beach. This comes after the schools lost access to launch from Dowling.

After expressing our concerns about traffic, and working with Legislator Tom Cilmi, the schools have agreed to transport students by bus in AND out of Timber Point, limiting vehicular traffic to just a handful of local students.

With only one bus per school, and one trip in and out between approximately 3pm and 6pm each day, we hope there will be little to no adverse traffic impacts. Therefore, Great River is happy to be a part of providing this opportunity for students. At the same time, we are showcasing our beautiful community to folks who might not otherwise see it.

It's important to note that permits are issued on a season to season basis and may be revoked at any time. Legislator Cilmi encourages residents to call his office should there be any problems once the program starts in September.

Great River Neighborhood Watch

"The Eyes and Ears of our Community"

Dear Great River Residents,

I wanted to take this opportunity to thank our community for your interest and support with starting the <u>Great River Neighborhood Watch (GRNW)</u>. The "Neighborhood Watch" program has been nationally proven to be a successful way to keep a community safe, educate all members about local/ current happenings and build camaraderie amongst neighbors.

Our program is broken down into two categories: Block Captains and GRNW Members.

Block captain must report any information received from members to GRNW coordinator. Once the coordinator receives the information, it will be posted on the Facebook page, all block captains will be notified and the calling/texting "tree" will begin to inform all members of a specific incident. Block captains are the main contact person for the members on their block. By having block captains, we are able to distribute the information to our community quickly. Block captains must attend GRNW meetings to develop plans of action, discuss current incidents/concerns of the community and help recruit other community members to become a part of the program.

Members of GRNW are the eyes and ears of the community. If something seems suspicious, depending on the severity, call the police and notify your block captain. This will allow us to warn the rest of the community. You will receive emails/telephone calls/text messages with any important warnings or information about something happening in the area. Some members may be asked to be a part of the calling tree if the block is long and the member is willing to take on that role. It is also important that members recruit others to become volunteers so that we can have as many eyes and ears communicating as possible.

It is important to remember the no one in the program is to act as a member of law enforcement or to take "matters into their own hands". Our purpose is to "see something, say something" and notify law enforcement and your block captain.

In order for your block to become official, it needs a block captain and more than 50% support from the neighbors. On the following page are our current official blocks and current unofficial blocks that have block captains but have not yet gained more than 50% support.





Town of Islip Noise Ordinance Information

There have been several complaints within the Great River Community about lawnmowers and other outdoor machinery being used prior to allowed time by the Town of Islip Code. There has also been a concern for private social events that have gone beyond the appropriate time. For your convenience and information, we have condensed the information found on the Town of Islip website in regards to this Code to make sure we are all informed and work as a community to abide by these Codes.

Noise from operation of machinery/construction should take place between the hours of 7:00AM-8:00PM on weekdays and 10:00AM – 5:00PM on Sundays. State or Federal holidays follow a Sunday schedule.

If you have any further questions about these Town of Islip Codes you may visit their website http://www.islipny.gov and go to E-Services, Town Code. You may also contact the Division of Law Enforcement with any noise complaints and/or questions at (631) 224-5375.

Town of Islip Garbage Pick-Up Regulations

There have also been several complaints within the Great River Community about neighbors putting garbage out over holiday weekends and several days before the scheduled pick-up date. This not only hinders the appearance of our beautiful community but it also encourages non-residents to drive around our community to "garbage pick" bringing unnecessary attention and jeopardizing the safety our community.

In reference to garbage pick-up regulations with respect to residents putting large pieces of furniture and other garbage on their front lawn for days before it is picked up; please note, as stated on the Recycling Calendar, Bulk Non-Metal (couch, mattress, etc.) is limited to 3 large items to be taken on the last household collection day of the week.

Garbage should not be put out earlier than 4:30PM the day before your scheduled garbage pick-up.

Monday & Thursday are garbage pick-up days in Great River. Wednesday is recycling pick-up day in Great River.

Should you have any additional questions or wish to report garbage being left out for days, please contact the Department of Environmental Control at 631-224-5645.





Cake:

1 (18 $\frac{1}{4}$ - ounce) Yellow Cake Mix 1 egg, 8 tablespoons butter, melted

Filling:

- 1 (8-ounce) cream cheese, softened
- 1 (15-ounce) can pumpkin
- 3 eggs, 8 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1 (16-ounce) box powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon each Cinnamon, Nutmeg, Vanilla

Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit.

To make the cake: Combine all of the ingredients and mix well with an electric mixer. Pat the mixture into the bottom of a lightly greased 13×9 -inch baking pan. Prepare filling.

To make the filling: In a large bowl, beat the cream cheese and pumpkin until smooth. Add the eggs, vanilla, and butter and beat together. Next, add the powdered sugar, cinnamon, and nutmeg and mix well. Spread the pumpkin mixture over cake batter and bake for 40-50 minutes. Make sure not to over bake as the center should be a little gooey.
