This, combined with our old housing stock, is resulting in homeowners overspending on bills for homes that are drafty and uncomfortable. Consumer tips & news

Do I really need to drain the gas from my snow blower before I store it?

According to Consumer reports...that depends. If you've added fuel stabilizer to the gas, all you need to do is top off the fuel tank. That leaves no room in the tank for water to condense and helps keep fuel from degrading over time.

But, if you've used gas straight from the pump at the station, which is generally blended with ethanol, you DO want to drain the fuel before storage. Mixed forms of ethanol and condensed water form corrosive acids that can clog the carburetor. CR suggests siphoning the fuel tank to remove most of the gas and then run the engine until its dry.

Should I reconsider buying a secondhand car seat for my child?

There are several reason why buying a used car seat might not be a good idea. As a buyer, you usually can't be 100% sure the seat has even been involved in an accident. Even if it looks in good shape, crash forces could have stressed the components. Expiration dates are also important, obeying them helps ensure that the components are still strong and the seat has the LATEST safety features.

Unless you can get a used one from someone you trust, its generally safer to buy a new one.

Make a video to protect your valuables.

If you ever had to replace all your stuff after a fire, flood or other disaster, you'll need to provide a detailed inventory of your belongings. But if the prospect of writing it all down as a precaution seems like to much, take a video. Capture your furnishings, don't forget to open cabinets, drawers, closets and boxes describing what is in them. Electronics, TV's, & artwork are also important to capture. Store the video in a cloud or disc that can be safely stored should you even need it.



RECALLS:

The main processing blade used for cutting, shopping and dicing on about 8 million Cuisinart food processors has been recalled it can crack and break over time; There have been 69 reports from consumers who found small metal pieces in food. The processors were sold in stores from July 1996 through December 2015.

You can call 877-339-2534 or go to Cuisinart.com to get a free replacement blade. You can still use the processor with its other attachments.

Kiddie is recalling about 3.6 million Nighthawk combination smoke/CO alarms. Once the backup batteries are replaced, the units fail to chirp when they reach their seven-year end of life, which may lead users to think they're still working. That means consumers may have no alert for a fire or CO incident. They were sold online and at home centers from June 2004 through December 2010.

Replace the alarm immediately and contact Kiddie 855-239-0490 or kiddie.com for a free replacement or a discount on a new one.

Gardening tips



Seed Starting. Start seeds of warm-season vegetables like peppers, eggplant, and tomatoes the first week in April. These will be ready for transplant into the garden in late May. Start seeds of herbs, such as dill, parsley and basil, inside through the end of the month, as well as flowers like zinnias and marigolds.

Save Your Soil. Prepare your garden soil once it has dried out and crumbles easily in your hand. Till in green manure crops that have wintered over.

Seed Savvy. Direct seed into the garden cool season vegetables and flowers including carrots, beets, peas, parsnips, foxgloves, and hollyhocks. Set out hardy seedlings such as onions, cabbage, leafy greens, pansies and snapdragons. Harden them off for a day or two by leaving them out in a protected area.

Potato Preparation. Pre-sprout potatoes two weeks in advance of setting them out in the garden to give them a head start.



Seeding Time. All the makings of borscht can be planted in the garden now: direct seed beets, plant potatoes, and cabbage seedlings. Warmseason vegetables, like the melon for melon soup, cucumbers and squash, need a jump-start inside three weeks before planting out around Memorial Day.

Tender Annuals Tip. Memorial Day is also the safe planting out date for tender annuals, dahlias, and tomatoes, peppers, and eggplants.

Spring Cleaning. Finish the spring cleanup, topdress garden beds with compost, and take bird feeders down.

Projects For Your Garden. Begin garden construction projects like pergolas and retaining walls or erect fencing and trellises.

Reminders of Winter. Assess the deer and frost damage, and replace affected trees and shrubs with hardier stock.

Flower Power. Enjoy spring flowers like peonies and early **roses**. Lilacs always signal Mother's Day in my garden, and make a fragrant bouquet for Mom.

Great River Sewer Proposal

Since our public meeting in December, we have continued our work on the Map and Plan report needed to start the process of forming the proposed sewer district extension. We are in the process of evaluating alternatives to the preliminary sewer system design and updating the overall project costs.


Additionally, the Governor's Office of Storm Recovery (GOSR), has begun the environmental assessment for this project. We have provided them with some preliminary information for their analysis and will continue to do so throughout the project. When we become aware of any meetings regarding that aspect of the project we will inform the community.

Suffolk County has been in contact with the State and Federal agencies involved with the of funding these sewer projects. Suffolk County is working on determining the exact grant versus loan amount for each of the proposed projects. Once that has been determined, we can present the community with a more accurate cost analysis.

Vidalia Onion Pie
