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Future Technology Teacher Scholarship Application Deadline: May 15th

The Wisconsin Technology Education Association seeks to encourage high school students to pursue a career as a K-12 Technology & Engineering teacher by providing financial assistance in the form of a \$1000 scholarship. Scholarship recipients may apply for a second payment of \$1000 prior for their student teaching experience.

Eligibility

- (a) The applicant must be a high school senior, or a high school graduate.
- (b) The applicant must be enrolled in an eligible technology education program
- (c) The applicant must be Wisconsin resident
- (d) In order to be considered the applicant must submit a completed application form, an essay, high school transcripts, and two letters of recommendation prior to the application deadline.

Selection Process

- (a) Applicants will be judged on the basis of the information provided in the application, school records, personal essay, and letters of recommendation.
- (b) All applications received prior to the application deadline will be reviewed and scored by the WTEA Foundation Scholarship Committee.

Award Procedure

- (a) The recipient will receive one payment of \$1000, a 4 year student membership to the WTEA, and free admission to the WTEA annual conference during the 4 years of their student membership. The payment will be made prior to the beginning of the freshman year.
- (b) Prior to their student teaching experience scholarship recipients may apply for a second scholarship award. If selected to receive a second payment, it will be presented to the student at the WTEA Awards Banquet held in conjunction with the annual WTEA conference. The WTEA will provide lodging and meals for the scholarship recipient when attending the banquet.

Instructions

- a) Complete the top half of the application form. Print the completed form. Sign the authorization for release. Have your school official complete the school certification section.
- b) Provide a one page description of your involvement in school and community extra-curricular activities (SkillsUSA, student government, sports, scouts, church activities, etc.).
- c) Write an essay, 200- 250 words long describing why you want to be a Technology Education teacher. Your essay should also identify who inspired you to choose a career in education.
- d) Provide a letter of recommendation from one of your high school or middle school Technology Education teachers
- e) Provide a second letter of recommendation from an adult (non-relative) who: served as your activity advisor, coach, supervised your employment, or was one of your high school teachers.
- f) Provide a legal copy of your high school transcript and a jpg photo of you suitable for publication (300 dpi or higher).
