



RULES OF THE SAWBRIDGEWORTH TENNIS CLUB

Founded 1920 – rules amended 2016

1. The Club shall be known as “The Sawbridgeworth Tennis Club”. The Club shall be managed by a Committee consisting Chairman/woman, Secretary, Treasurer, a Men’s Team Captain, a Ladies’ Team Captain, Social Secretary, Membership Secretary, Welfare Officer, Fixtures Secretary, Sports and Social Club Representative, Club Site Administrator and the Head Coach. They will be elected at the Annual General Meeting. The Committee shall have the power to fill vacancies and to co-opt members in the interim. Six members shall form a quorum.
2. The purpose of the Club is to promote the amateur sport of tennis in Sawbridgeworth and encourage community participation in tennis.
3. Membership of the Club shall be open to anyone interested in the sport on application regardless of sex, age, disability, ethnicity, nationality, sexual orientation, religion, or other beliefs. However, limitation of membership according to available facilities is allowable on a non-discriminatory basis, such limitation to be left to the discretion of the Committee. The Club may have different classes of membership and subscription on a non-discriminatory and fair basis. The Club will keep subscriptions at levels that will not pose a significant obstacle to people participating.
4. The Club Committee may refuse membership, or remove it, only for good cause such as conduct or character likely to bring the Club or sport into disrepute. Appeal against refusal or removal may be made, and a personal hearing will take place before the Committee of the Club within 28 days of the said refusal/expulsion.
5. The annual subscription for the different classes of membership shall be fixed at the Annual General Meeting and be due on 1st May. Entrance fees and subscription fees will be published in the Club House. Members joining after that date will be charged a pro-rata fee. Anyone who has not paid their subscription by the 30th June will be deemed to have resigned and not available for club play or matches. Rejoining after that date will be deemed a fresh application to the Committee.
6. Each member shall be entitled to introduce a visitor(s), subject to payment of the visitors’ fee for each day’s play. Visitor’s fees shall be fixed at the Annual General Meeting. Temporary membership may be applied for.

7. There may be provision at the discretion of the Membership Secretary to apply for temporary membership.
8. Recognised tennis wear including non-marking tennis shoes, must be worn on court at all times. Casual clothes such as football shirts and inscribed t-shirts are not permitted. Members at all times when playing should wear the membership tags.
9. The Committee has the right to prohibit play whenever the courts are considered unfit for play.
10. The Committee may at any time reserve one or more courts for the purpose of tournaments or matches, and further to enforce such regulations for the use and control of the courts as they may deem expedient.
11. During general Club playing sessions, players must vacate the courts after playing one short set (6-5) and any senior members present and waiting to play must be included. Singles may not be played at the expense of doubles play.
12. The property and funds of the Club cannot be used for the direct or indirect private benefit of its members other than reasonably allowed by this Rule. The Club may offer sporting and related social facilities, club sporting equipment, coaching, courses, post-match refreshments and other ordinary benefits of Community Amateur Sports Clubs as provided for in the Finance Act 2002.
13. A Special General Meeting may be called on a written application signed by 15 members.
14. The Rules shall not be altered except at the Annual General Meeting (or a specially called Extraordinary General Meeting) of which every member shall have 7 days' notice, including details of the proposed amendments.
15. If at any General Meeting of the Club a resolution be passed calling for the dissolution of the Club, the secretary shall immediately convene a Special General Meeting of the Club to be held not less than one month thereafter to discuss and vote upon the resolution. If at that Special General Meeting the resolution is carried by at least two-thirds of the Full Members present at the meeting, the Committee shall thereupon, or at such date as shall have been specified in the resolution, proceed to realise the assets of the Club and discharge all the debts and liabilities of the Club. After discharging all debts and liabilities of the Club, the remaining assets shall not be paid or distributed amongst the full members of the Club, but shall be given or transferred to the Lawn Tennis Association for use by them for related community tennis.
16. The Committee are empowered on behalf of the members upon agreement being obtained at a specially convened General Meeting, to borrow money for the purpose of the Club in such amounts and upon such terms as to the interest, security and otherwise as may be from time to time be determined.
17. Each member agrees as a condition of membership:

(A) to be bound by and subject to these Rules

(B) to be bound by and subject to the LTA Rules and the LTA Disciplinary Code.

This Rule confers a benefit on the LTA and, subject to the remaining provisions of this rule, is intended to be enforceable by the LTA by virtue of the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999. For the avoidance of doubt, the members do not intend that any term of these Rules, apart from this Rule should be enforceable, by virtue of the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999, by any person who is not a party to this agreement.

18. The Club agrees that each member of the Committee will be required, as a condition of election or appointment, to agree to be bound by and subject to these Rules, the LTA Rules and the LTA Disciplinary Code, such agreement to contain an express acknowledgement that the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999 applies and that the LTA and the Club can enforce any breach at its option and in its sole discretion.
19. The Club agrees that all unlicensed and unregistered coaches and, so far as reasonably practicable, players and other persons using the facilities of the Club will be required, as a condition of such use, to agree to be bound by and subject to these Rules, the LTA Rules and the LTA Disciplinary Code, such agreement to contain an express acknowledgement that the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999 applies and that the LTA and the Club can enforce any breach of its option and in its sole discretion.
20. The decision of the Committee shall be final and binding in any matters not provided for in these Rules, however, where there is conflict between any of the above Rules ('key Rules') and any other Rule or Rules the key Rule(s) will take priority. Interpretation of all of the Rules must be consistent with the statutory requirements for CASCs (which means Community Amateur Sports Clubs as first provided for by the Finance Act 2002).
