- We are still looking for help to coordinate PTO organized activities: music playlist and speakers; street

Executive Board Report

Remaining funds (Heather Cobb)

- Some of it is moving to same line item for following year
 - Motion to reallocate remaining funds to add into the same line item for next year's budget: cultural arts, teacher appreciation, book fair books, school beautification. Seconded by Aaron Zain. Unanimously supported. Carries.
- Some of it will go into the PTO general fund (savings) for future use
 - Motion to reallocate funds to general fund from special projects events, multilingual dinner (used for yearbooks), \$ 55 bus driver appreciation (went over \$75 for end of year activities), \$2500 for camp hazen field day. Seconded by Jen Rice. Unanimously supported. Carries
- Motion to reallocate \$75 from bus driver appreciation to 2025 end of year activities. Seconded by Aaron Z. Unanimously supported. Carries
- 6th grade night, field trips, remaining operations budget are pending
 - Motion to reallocate any remaining funds at end of fiscal year to go into 2025-26 PTO general fund. Seconded by Aaron Z. Unanimously supported. Carries

Fishtank fundraiser (James Gryzbowski)

- Success. Raised enough money for a new fishtank and more for maintenance.
- Thank Whelen for generous donation and Chester Rotary upgrade camera
- Main tank cost slightly under estimated \$10k (\$9695). The tank requires a 16 week lead time. Acrylic tank.
- Will need to purchase other supplies: heater \$70-100, salt \$200, return pump \$230, live san 400-600, skimmer \$850m, lighting still researching.
- Will receive the tank in fall (October/Fall), so kids can see the process they will see fish kept in an old tank while the new tank acclimates. The process will take 4 weeks.
- Sponsorship signage will be created featuring PTO. Whelen does not want signage.
- Use the fishtank as a way to get new parents involved
- Ribbon cutting ceremony, can PTO use the fishtank as a marketing tool
- New fish, corral, rotating accessories.
- Funds cover maintenance. Because we raised more than goal, there will be funds for fish, corals, and new materials for maintenance. The school has a line item for the maintenance budget.
