Budget Motion

<u>Heart Cart</u>: Jen Rice - made a motion to allocate \$300 remaining from teacher appreciation budget to heart cart next year. Aaron Zain seconds the motion. Because we were having trouble getting consistent donations from parents. Becca Sinusas commented that Andrea Selmer said we got the same level of donations this year as last year. Would be good to account for times when parents are already being asked to donate for the baskets, spring fling, etc. The \$300 would supplement the heart cart. Aaron asks for a vote, which was unanimous.

<u>Subsidized yearbooks</u>: Diane Amara asked for 20 yearbooks for children on free and reduced lunch. Heather Cobb proposes re-allocating \$300 from multilanguage dinner and remaining balance \$125.80 from bus driver breakfast, Aaron Z makes a motion to use this money. Larger number than previous years. David Champlin seconds the motion. Aaron Z calls a vote, unanimously approved.
